IT IS NOT ALL ABOUT YOU AND/OR ME!!!

My years of seminary formation at St John's Seminary Wonersh are years I will forever treasure for three things (The 3 Fs): the Formation I received, the Friends I made and the Formators who formed me. My House Formator - Mgr Gerry Ewing and my Spiritual Director - Canon Luke Smith, contributed enormously in shaping my priesthood and spirituality. In a seminary where young men with varied vitalities, visions and vocations are trained, Canon Luke Smith who was our in-house spiritual director always reminded us that - IT IS NOT ALL ABOUT US! This statement always had me and my classmates bursting with laughter because one of the modules we studied in Pastoral Theology class was - IT IS ALL ABOUT ME! Since I was the one who perfectly diagnosed the pastoral situation, my classmates nicknamed me - IT IS ALL ABOUT ME! In today's readings which are centred on recognising the Lord, we hear John the Beloved, telling Peter – IT IS THE LORD (HO ESTIN KYRIOS)! This statement which appears three times in our gospel pericope of today, reminds us of who is always in charge. Because the Lord is in charge, Peter, and the other apostles in today's first reading told the Sanhedrin that obedience to God comes first before obedience to men.

As I celebrate my 40th Birthday today (1st May 1982), I remind myself that – **IT IS THE LORD! It is the Lord** who blessed me with amazing parents, family members, friends, teachers, folks, and parishioners. **It is the Lord** who chose me as one of His ministers even though I have betrayed Him countless times like Peter. **It is the Lord** who gave me little gifts to help build-up His Church and not for my own self-aggrandisement. Like St John the Beloved, I pray that through my personal life and priestly ministry, I will always point everyone to the Lord and not myself. I join today's Psalmist in praising the Lord who rescued me from the pit of destruction I was plunged into in the past and did not allow my enemies to rejoice over me. Let us always remember, it is not all about us but the Lord. To Him be all praise, honour, glory, and power, forever and ever, Amen.

Restored Lives. 'The Church needs to be a safe environment where everybody is welcomed and included no matter their situations and/or circumstances in life; especially young people, women, divorced and/or remarried couples.'

In our recent Synodal survey where open, exploratory questions were asked, individuals contributed with a number of heartfelt and troubled responses. An area that we still need to work at as church and society is the way we treat those whose marriages have failed for whatever reason, and particularly where people feel alienated. If this applies to you, we have listened and want to respond.

In 2 weeks' time we are offering another opportunity for individuals to join our "Restored Lives" Course. This course helps people to recover from the experiences of divorce or relationship breakdown and rebuild self confidence. The course outlines the journey from breakdown to recovery, exploring communication, handling conflict, conflict resolution, managing other relationships and letting go.

There are six online evenings **starting on Monday 9th May (7-9pm)**. The course is founded on Christian principles but open to all. You will meet with others at different stages of broken relationships and will have the opportunity to share and explore in a safe and welcoming environment.
