A Few Words...

Today is 'Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord' and commences Holy Week: the most important week in the Church's Year. Holy Week often called the 'Great Week' because it is when the Church celebrates, in a solemn way the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Christ. In this 'Great Week', we are invited to journey with Jesus through His passion to His death and subsequent resurrection.

On Holy Thursday - 8 pm in St Edmund's (6.15 pm for families in St Joseph's) - we celebrate the Lord's Supper, when Jesus celebrated the Passover with His disciples, a Passover with a difference. This was to be His last until the eternal banquet. At supper He not only gave them an example of service (washing of feet), He gave them Bread and Wine, His Body and Blood: "Do this in memory of Me". Then, after Judas left to betray Him - night fell - and Jesus went to the Garden of Gethsemane to pray. We are invited to 'watch' with Jesus until midnight.

After His arrest, trial and sentence, Jesus is led up to Calvary to be crucified and die: Friday at 11.30am for families at St Joseph's; 3pm at St Edmund's.

After burial and on the 'first day of the week' the tomb is empty. Jesus has risen. New life has broken the bonds of sin and death. This is celebrated at the Easter Vigil at 9pm on Saturday at St Edmund's, with the Liturgy of Light, Liturgy of Baptism and the Liturgy of the Word and Eucharist.

On Easter Sunday we again celebrate the Resurrection with Masses all day: 9am, 11am and 7pm at St Edmund's and 10am at St Joseph's.

Come and join the Parish as we celebrate that which is central to our faith: Jesus' Passion, Death and Resurrection.

To prepare us to celebrate Holy Week well we begin with a Penitential Service on Monday (3rd April) at 7.30pm in St Edmund's Church. Priests from around the Deanery will be available to hear 'confession'. Do come along and celebrate God's love, mercy, and forgiveness of us all.

Make the Triduum - The Lord's Supper, Crucifixion and Resurrection - a priority in your week. The 'Three Days of Salvation' are, to all intents and purposes, one long, three-day, celebration of Salvation History!

Come......come......come!

> We are part of Catholic Diocese of Portsmouth, Registered Charity Number 1199568.

At the end of the Mass of the Lord's Supper the Eucharist is taken in procession from where Mass has been celebrated to the place of repose. After the Blessed Sacrament has been placed in the tabernacle there is period of watching and adoration which continues until midnight. The time of watching is one of adoration of the Blessed Sacrament but is not a celebration of Exposition and Benediction. The consecrated host is not exposed in a monstrance and no words are said by the Priest following the Prayer after Communion. It is as much a time of personal prayer.

The Church's celebration of the Paschal Triduum is a remembering (anamnesis) of the events of Jesus' Passion, Death and Resurrection. In the period of watching it is both remembering the events following the Lord's supper and adoration of the Risen Christ, present in the Blessed Sacrament.


