Contradictions and affirmations

The statement made by Jesus in today's gospel: 'Anyone who finds his life will lose it and anyone who loses his life for My sake, will save it', is one of a number of apparent contradictions that we find in Scripture. 'The last shall be first, He became poor in order that we might become rich, the Son of Man came to serve not to be served...'.

And Jesus' opening instruction to His disciples 'Anyone who prefers mother or father to Me is not worthy of Me' presents yet another challenge. Jesus is not trying to say that the love of our children or parents is in opposition to our love for Him. Eleonore Stump in her spiritual reflections for this Sunday reminds those who are mothers of those feelings when a second child is born ...can we love this one as much as our first born? I remember this well. It was hard to imagine how I could find the depth and extent of that love that I had for my first son a second time without diluting my love for him. And when my younger son had to have open heart surgery for a heart defect I also found myself pondering the question.... How would I cope if either of my sons were taken away from me through death or illness?

St Paul in his letter to the Romans reminds the Church that if we are prepared to die with Christ, we shall also live with Him. We must be prepared to empty ourselves to be filled with God's love and God's life and it is this love which enables us to give love to others in ways that we cannot comprehend. It has allowed me to accept that my children (now young adults) are a gift from God and that they are not mine to hang onto if God has other plans.

In our First Reading we witness life being given and life being taken away. The childless woman is given a son; he dies as a young man but when Elisha visits as God's emissary he brings the child back to life.

Jesus also mentions the need to place our fathers and mothers second in ranking in His instructions which does not sit comfortably with our reading of the fifth commandment 'Honour your Father and Mother'. In the context of families and relationships I am reminded as I prepare for another Annual Pilgrimage to Lourdes that those whom I travel with and serve year on year, have become another family, a God given family and I would also say that of our own parish that it is also family. When my mother died in 2017, I found the loss extremely hard and wondered how I would manage without an earthly mother. God in His love and kindness has given me my spiritual mother and Our Lady calls me and my pilgrimage family back to see Her in Lourdes each year.

In our Alpha meeting last Tuesday, we wrestled with the question of 'Why did Jesus die?'. He died that we might live! These apparent contradictions in Scripture and in our understanding of faith encourage us to go deeper to make sense of them and to become the empty vessel in order that we can be filled with God's love and God's life, which is not in competition but in affirmation.

KSC National Relics Tour 2023 - coming to this Parish! This coming Wednesday the Relics of St Columba, St Margaret and St Andrew will be coming to St Edmund's Church, along with the Fraternal Cross and the St Columba Cross. This is part of a National Tour of the Relics and we are very honoured to be able to bring these Relics to your Parish and allow Parishioners to venerate these Relics after 7pm Mass.

The relics on display encompass a diverse array of saints, each with their own compelling story and heavenly intercession. Among the treasures to be showcased are relics of Saint Andrew, Apostle and Martyr, who was the brother of Saint Peter the First Pope; relics of Saint Margaret of Scotland, whose charity and piety was well known throughout her realm; and relics of Saint Columba of Iona, the patron saint of The Order of the Knights of Saint Columba, renowned for their missionary work and founding of monasteries.

The relics will then progress down through Hampshire via Basingstoke, Eastleigh, Southampton, Park Gate, I.O.W., & then Poole & Glastonbury. The Relics come to St John's Cathedral Portsmouth on Saturday 15th July and depart the Cathedral after 6pm Mass Sunday 16th.

"The National Relic Tour 2023 is an extraordinary occasion for all Catholics to come together, be inspired by the lives of the saints, and experience the power of faith," said Henry Welsh, Supreme Knight of the Order of the Knights of Saint Columba. "We invite everyone, from the young to the old, to join us on this remarkable journey of spiritual enlightenment and renewal."

We thank Fr Vincent for allowing us to bring these Relics to your Church and Fr Johnpromise who will welcome the Relics and lead devotions.
