THEY WERE CAUGHT, WE WERE LUCKY!

As the Catholic Bishop of Rochester New York, the Venerable Archbishop Fulton John Sheen was asked to give a talk to inmates at a high-security prison in the US and he accepted. On getting to this high-security prison, Archbishop Sheen glanced at the faces of the prisoners and his heart sank. He then addressed them saying: "Gentlemen, there is one great difference between you and me – you have been caught; I was not. In other words, we are all sinners." At those words, the prisoners burst into laughter, later composed themselves, and listened wholeheartedly to Archbishop Sheen who won them over by his honesty and inclusivity.

In today's Gospel, we are presented with the story of a woman caught in the very act of adultery which shows the hypocrisy of the Scribes and the Pharisees. What happened to the man? Was he so strong and powerful that he escaped the Scribes and the Pharisees? I do not think so! Although the Torah in Deuteronomy 22:22-24 condemned both the man and woman and stipulated their death sentence; the Scribes and the Pharisees who were products of the Jewish paternalistic culture, ditched that, and condemned only the woman. This is hypocrisy at its zenith! Alas, Christ was there to remedy the situation by turning the lights of self-reflection onto them; and having been convicted (Elegcho - Exposed) by their conscience (Suneidesis - The Soul as distinguishing between what is morally good and bad), they realised their own sins and left the woman alone with Jesus. My friends, we are all sinners in need of God's help. The only difference between us and the woman above, is that she was caught, but we were lucky. Let us not recall the past nor think we can attain perfection by our own efforts as we were admonished in today's First and Second Readings respectively. Like the inmates of that highsecurity prison and the woman in today's Gospel, let us always recall the words of Christ: "Neither do I condemn you, go away and sin no more." Remember, even when we fall into sins again, let us return to Christ in the Sacrament of Reconciliation and beg for forgiveness. I have never seen Him reject anyone, including myself who is the worst sinner.

1. What does Jesus' refusal to condemn the woman caught in adultery say to us (Gospel)? What does it say about judging others? What does it say about our own sinfulness?

2. *"I am doing a new deed"* God says *"by making a road in the wilderness....."* (1st reading). What is that 'road' for you? What is the 'wilderness' you are struggling with?

3. ".....*perfection comes through faith in Christ*.." (2nd reading). How can you trust more in faith rather than your own efforts?
