Do not be afraid.....

In today's Gospel we hear about Jesus sending out seventy-two others ahead of Him, in pairs, to all the towns and places He himself was going to visit. We ought to think about how Jesus sends us out today. Inspired by the Holy Spirit, we are sent to accomplish the Lord's will, to try and align our will with His.

St Charles de Foucauld lived his Christian faith with simplicity and intensity. In his early years he describes himself as totally selfish and full of vanity, engulfed by a desire for what is evil. In 1880 Saint Charles travels to Algeria and that is where everything changes for him. His fundamental principle is simple: Carry the Gospel with you, not by preaching it with your mouths, but by preaching it through your examples; not by proclaiming it, but by living it.

The work of discipleship is deeply challenging. Yet today's readings keep pulling us back to joy. We hear over and over "rejoice". In the face of challenges, God will always be there to console us, comfort us, and bring us everlasting peace.

I recently got back from a silent retreat at Minsteracres near Durham.

Initially I did not want to go, as it was a very long journey, it was an unfamiliar location and there wasn't much to do there. I went there with a list of all the things I wanted God to do for me, but He showed me that my problems weren't that important. It was better for me to listen to God. Like in our Gospel, being sent out into the world helps us to keep our eyes raised up towards heaven, focused on the eternal life that God has promised us through His Son our Lord Jesus Christ.

How many ways of teaching do you have Lord? How gentle and caring You are when we are at our weakest and lowest. Teach me to rest in You, teach me to trust in You, teach me to love You. Give us the strength we need Lord to do Your will.

PARISH MISSION STATEMENT:

We the people of St Joseph's and St Edmund's City Centre Catholic Parish, Southampton, sisters and brothers in Christ, accept as our mission, in the service of God and as a community of disciples - to share God's love with all those we meet - to welcome all so as to help others find and recognise Christ in their lives - to exercise mercy and understanding with ourselves and others.

CONFESSION: ITS ESSENCE

"We sometimes hear some statement such as this: 'I never could believe in confession. If I do wrong, I'll tell God I'm sorry in the secrecy of my own heart and God will forgive me, I don't have to tell my sins to any mere man in order to obtain forgiveness.'

First of all, the question is not whether we like confession, or whether we would prefer to have our sins forgiven in some other way. The question is, **how does God want it done?**

By requiring us to explicitly confess our sins, God protects us against the universal human weakness of self-justification. It is very well to say that in the secrecy of our own heart, we will tell God that we are sorry, and God will forgive us. If that were all that is required of us, it would be so easy for us to fool ourselves into thinking that we were sorry, while we blithely forth to sin again and again. But when we have to drag our evil out into

light, to get on our knees and put our wrongdoing into words, then we have to face the facts. It is no longer easy to deceive ourselves."
