





A Trinitarian God who comes to meet us and greet us where we are.

Empowered by the gift of the Holy Spirit which came down upon us all on the Feast of Pentecost last weekend we are now invited into the Mystery of The Holy Trinity. This dynamic relationship leads us into a deeper understanding of not only who God is to us but who we are in relationship to Him.

As Catholics we have continual reminders of the centrality of the Trinity in the daily practice of our faith. We make the sign of the Cross as we pray, at the beginning and end of Mass. Our response at the end of every psalm as we pray the Prayer of the Church is 'Glory be to the Father and the Son and to the Holy Spirit'. We proclaim the Gloria at each Mass and integral to our profession of faith is to proclaim our belief in God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. Last Sunday Sam was welcomed into full Communion of the Catholic Church through Confirmation. He declared his belief in the Trinity in a threefold 'Yes'. We affirmed that belief by responding 'This is our faith, this is the faith of the Church, and we are proud to profess it in Christ Jesus our Lord'.

In two weeks' time we begin another Alpha series in the parish. Those who come will be invited to explore these important questions of faith: Who is God, who is Jesus, and who is the Holy Spirit - three individual persons in one God. The Trinity remains a mystery but fundamental to any understanding is our receptivity and openness to Divine Revelation. It is God who created us, Jesus, who through His incarnation identified with us in our humanity and leads us, and the Holy Spirit who sustains us. Iconographers and artists over the centuries have attempted to illustrate the nature of the Trinity in various forms. The Hospitality of Abraham is an icon created by the Russian painter Rublev which depicts three angels sitting around a table in a circle representing spiritual unity, peace and harmony, mutual love and humility. There is a space left for Abraham at the table welcoming him into that relationship but this should also speak to you and me, those coming into the Church and those joining Alpha ..it is each one of us who are invited into that relationship. Let our response be Yes!
