Greeting God and Being Greeted by God

When visiting an overseas country it is good to learn the local greeting. I have been to Dublin just twice - my apologies to those of Irish heritage. The Gaelic for hello is: 'Dia is Muire dhuit', literally translated as 'Jesus and Mary be with you'. I read that the reply in Gaelic is: 'Jesus, Mary and Patrick be with you'. (Fortunately, although greeted often it was never in Gaelic). At school I learnt German and whilst cycling across the north German plain one greeted other cyclists with a cheery, 'Grüss Gott', literally 'God greet you'. As we know, after crossing ourselves as we begin Mass, the initial exchange between celebrant and people is 'The Lord be with you' to which is replied 'And with your spirit'.

A delightful year group of children from Maytree School visited St Edmund's last week when we explored the construction of our Advent Wreath by Richard and Teresa, and the meaning of Advent - God's coming as Jesus His Son, His arrival, His presence amongst us, and His presence in us.

Of course, Jesus does not come from afar, He stands at the door and knocks. Put "Light of the World by William Holden Hunt" into your favourite internet search engine and contemplate the painting. There we see Jesus knocking at the door where the only handle is on the inside where we are. It is not Jesus who is far from us, but we who are absent from Him. Our absence not measured in terms of distance but by desire. We have allowed our desires to carry us elsewhere, to estrange ourselves from our own heart. This is what Advent is all about, it is not a journey elsewhere, but a pilgrimage into the deserts of our own hearts.

To be a member of the Church is to celebrate this liturgy, a liturgy of praise and thanksgiving, to give beauty back to God, indeed to offer our lives as a liturgy of praise and thanksgiving, thereby becoming a sign of God's presence and a witness to hope.

A Few Words...

Well Advent is picking up speed towards Christmas!! As you will be aware this Advent is the longest it can be: time to benefit through the preparation that Advent affords us. As I mentioned last week, we will, of course, have a Penitential Service on Monday, 19th December at 7.30pm... so put it in your diary! Thursday (8th) is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception with Mass in St Joseph's at 12.15pm.

First Holy Communion registration is now closed. It's amazing that we have about 120 registered. The largest number ever on record! This does mean that we cannot, under any circumstances, accept any more applications.

Distribution and reception of Holy Communion: we are doing all we can to minimise risk of cross-infection of any respiratory disease, especially COVID: priest/deacon and Extraordinary Minister sanitising and wearing mask. To this end if you desire to receive Holy Communion on your tongue please make sure you are at the end of the queue! This is not being awkward, but if one person is infected (many like Father Johnpromise and me don't show any symptoms) then the next person risks infection and, quite possibly, the whole ciborium gets infected. Why take the risk? I will not take the risk so to protect the most vulnerable in our community and at Mass!

It would be great if everyone looked ahead to their choice of **Christmas Cards and Gift Wrap**. There is an increasingly good choice of recyclable items in both categories. The simpler the look the better. Shiny paper, glazed paper, cards with glitter or plastic embellishment and also Sellotape or equivalent are not able to be recycled. The Hampshire Refillery and Lemon and Jinja both stock recyclable wrapping paper and sticky tape or coloured string. But you can get all this in a number of shops these days usually clearly labelled as recyclable. We have probably all noticed that Christmas cards which reflect the true meaning of Christmas can be harder to find but hopefully we will all search out those! Please also **save your stamps** for the leprosy mission and Alzheimer's Society (buckets as ever at the back of both churches.) It is important to cut them from the envelope with a decent margin of paper to ensure perforations are undamaged. Torn stamps are valueless.


