



Questions to Ponder for the Week...

- 1. Jesus invited three of his disciples (and us) to gaze at him in his transfiguration (Gospel). Do you ask yourself every night if you saw Jesus during the day? The apostles were in anguish when they heard about Jesus' upcoming death. Jesus takes them up the mountain with him. At times because of moments of darkness do we need to go up the mountain too?
- 2. What was Abraham's response to God's request (1st reading)? Does this incident relate to your Lenten experience in any way? God called him out of his homeland to start something new. Does God sometimes call you out of your comfort zone or your favourite chair to start something new?
- 3. Are we all called to become a living Gospel in the world (2nd reading)? Will that involve some hardship? What does Paul's letter to Timothy say about this? Will it involve some joy?

Petition to stop the introduction of abortion up to birth

In 2021, abortion campaigners brought forward an amendment to introduced abortion on demand, for any reason, up to birth (including sex-selective abortion). This amendment did not go to a vote and pass, but the abortion lobby is expected to make another attempt to introduce this extreme abortion law change shortly. This would be the single biggest change to abortion legislation since 1967 and would introduce one of the most extreme abortion laws in the world. Hall Usage & Heating Costs

It will not come as a surprise to any of us that gas and electricity bills have risen significantly over the last few months.

Our heating bills for our churches and halls are rather large (into the thousands) each month, and of course we have the heating of our office, student house $\mathcal E$ presbytery on top of these costs.

The parish has reviewed current hall usage and raised the rents to £25 per hour for groups/parties and £20 per hour for charities.

Parish groups using our halls are at present not charged for hall usage as we know how vital they are to the life of the parish, but we are asking that if groups are able they consider making some sort of contribution to the costs involved in their hall usage (heating/lights/electricity).


