Somewhen and somewhere to start

One of the things we always looked for when students were making application to enter university was that their supporting statement included reference to them taking on additional responsibilities in some way. The nature of the responsibility was not so important as their having served their community.

The difficulty is that responsibility can at times engender an increased sense of personal importance. Leading can give way to domination and intimidation, enabling can give way to belittling. Responsibility if not discharged properly can transform into abuse. But we have to start somewhere. What we sought were students who had embarked on that journey of learning and self-discovery.

As is often portrayed to us in the Gospels, some of the Pharisees rejoice too keenly in the honours and perks of their position and use their authority to abuse others. This Sunday Jesus takes us a little further in our learning, he beckons us to be discerning in the path and teaching we follow, listening to "God's message and not some human thinking" as St Paul writes to the people of Thessaloniki.

There are teachers who enable their pupils to understand why, and then there are others; just as there are leaders and other leaders. And we all have to start somewhere, and that somewhere has to be centred on the word of God.

Jesus' vision is utterly liberating. It is a community of sisters and brothers whose thirst is for the healing power of God's Word in their hearts, who allow themselves to be transformed, and to speak and to act from the guidance of the Holy Spirit. From within this community people are called to the service which is leadership. And yes, it is easier said than done, but we have to start somewhere. There may well be tensions, there will be mistakes - and what was missed by some of those Pharisees, the need to receive and show mercy.

This community, this parish, our parish has an almost surfeit of groups in which, and with whom, we can participate and we can learn how to lead in some way, and importantly to help others to learn through our support and guidance. Join a group, and if you are not certain which, ask someone, we do try to be merciful, we do try to be enabling. We all started somewhere.
