HAS GOD EVER REVEALED HIMSELF TO YOU AND ME?

On the 31st of July, I watched the acclaimed Christopher Nolan film - 'Oppenheimer', centred on 'The Manhattan Project' that produced the first nuclear weapons used in bombing Hiroshima and Nagasaki. During the discussions that Oppenheimer had with the theoretical physicist, Werner Heisenberg, before the nuclear weapons were developed, Heisenberg reminded him that "the real issue here is not whether you can read music, but whether you can hear and feel it". Oppenheimer who could hear and feel the music regarding the dangers of what they were about to develop, confided in Albert Einstein that atomic bomb risks triggering an unstoppable chain reaction that could destroy the world. When that predication came to pass in Hiroshima and Nagasaki, Oppenheimer told President Truman that he felt he had blood on his hands.

On this Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord, we encounter in today's Gospel the complete and perfect revelation of God in the person of Jesus Christ, made manifest in the disciples' witnessing of Christ's true metamorphosis (Metamorphoo) and the hearing of the voice of the Father commanding them to listen to Him. It is this same theophanic imagery of God's magnificent glory that was depicted in our First Reading and affirmed by St Peter in our Second Reading when he confirmed what they saw, heard, and felt. My friends, has God ever revealed Himself to you and me? Many of us might be praying to see, hear and feel God like the apostles did in today's Gospel but neglect the fact that God has revealed, continues to reveal, and will always reveal Himself to us. Yes, God has revealed Himself to us in the unity that is palpable at the gathering in Lisbon of Pope Francis with thousands of youths from around the globe in the ongoing World Youth Day. God has revealed Himself to us in all the people we meet each day especially in those suffering and on the margins of society. Finally, God has revealed Himself to us in His Creation/Environment which we ought to look after. As Heisenberg told Oppenheimer above, the real issue here is not whether we can see, hear, and feel the music, but whether we are able to see, hear and feel God's revelation of Himself in ourselves, the people around us and in His creation. As St

Irenaeus stated - Man/Woman fully alive, is the glory of God!!!

Called & Gifted Coming to St Boniface in September!

"Called and Gifted" is a Catholic organisation approved by Bishop Philip. Sherry Weddell, co-founder of the Catherine of Siena Institute (CSI), introduced the Called and Gifted Charism Discernment process to the Portsmouth diocese in 2014. Since then, she and her team of Called and Gifted Teachers and Discernment Facilitators have helped many Catholic parishes and parishioners across the diocese to discern their gifts and put them into practice.

Please consider joining us on a special teaching day that will be held on **9 September 2023** St Boniface church hall. This will be followed by **one-to-one discernment conversations** via Zoom or in-person with a trained facilitator to help us unlock our potential charisms. Finally, we will be encouraged to begin "experimenting" with our discerned charism by putting it into **concrete practice**. There is a minimal fee involved. We will give you more details as we get closer to the teaching day. Please consider taking part in this special event.

URGENT Gift Aid Forms

All gift aiders to the parish **must please send a new Gift Aid Declaration as soon as possible** to the Parish Office.

As the Diocese has changed to the Catholic Diocese of Portsmouth we have been asked to fill in new forms under the new name. If you have changed address or have a new name you must also fill in a new form.

Out of 643 Gift Aiders only 61 new forms have been returned. If we do not receive a new form from these gift aiders before 27th of August we will be removing them from our records and no longer claiming. Please do collect and fill in a new gift aid form if you did not do one this year (from January 2023). Forms are available at the back of church or can be posted / emailed from the Office if requested.

Our current claim (money received January - June) pending submission will drop substantially if we have to remove the 80 active donors whose forms we are still waiting to receive.

Gift aid is a tax relief for charities in the UK that increases donations by 25% at no extra cost to the donor. The charity is able to claim back tax that a donor has already paid to the government. We can claim this money at no additional cost to you!

- 1) I have filled in the declaration form and signed it, what do I do now? Now you need to return the form to Anna in the Parish Office. You can hand deliver it, post it, email a scanned copy or you can give your forms to the priests at Mass to return to Anna.
- 2) How can I donate to the parish so they can identify me as a gift aider? As long as we have your gift aid form all donations you make (that we can identify!) we claim on:

Standing Orders with the donor's name are the easiest way for the Parish to identify gift aiders, and the reliable predictable income helps the parish to budget.

Bank Transfers are equally easy to match to a gift aider as long as the bank account is a donor's name (or the reference).

Cheques (made payable to CDP SOUJE) as long as we know the purpose of the donation we can claim. **Cash must be in an envelope** marked with your name, or can be brought directly into the Parish Office.

Contactless Machines take care of the gift aid forms automatically once you donate (if you donate to the parish by ways other than the contactless machine, you will still need to fill in a new gift aid form for us to claim

on that).

There are new Brown Door keys, if you still have the old set please return them to the office at your convenience.
