## Allegiance to God and King

This Saturday we will witness the Coronation of King Charles III. For some of us it will be our first experience of a coronation in our lifetime and many of us will be still grieving the loss of Queen Elizabeth II who not only lived, but exemplified allegiance to her country and her God.

As Catholic Christians, what should our approach be to this momentous event?

There are many elements in the coronation ceremony that should be applauded and commended. King Charles will be anointed with oil that has come from olive trees in a Greek Orthodox Monastery where his grandmother is buried. It has been blessed in the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem by a Greek Orthodox Patriarch. A Greek Orthodox chant will be part of the service. The anointing will take place behind a screen, signifying its import and solemnity. The King will enter the Abbey behind a processional Cross he gave to the Church in Wales, and embedded in this cross is a relic of the True Cross, a gift from Pope Francis. The King has asked that the celebration and reception of Communion is part of the Coronation service and it is poignant to reflect on the fact that King Charles will be the first to receive communion in his outstretched hands before all those who are present, who will be invited to follow him in this act of 'Communion'.

However there may be some confusion and consternation prompted by the announcement this week that Charles has asked that all those who are both present and watching the ceremony should recite their allegiance to the King of England. I have to admit that I was one of the sceptical ones, but purely because my ultimate allegiance as a Christian is to Almighty God. 'You cannot serve both God and mammon'. And yet if we return to the gospels it was Jesus who clearly said to the pharisees when they questioned Him about paying allegiance and tax to the Roman authorities, that they should render to the authority what is due to them.

Jesus is saying that we should not separate ourselves from the world or from those who are chosen to lead us, as long as it does not mean compromising our faith. An article in the Tablet last weekend asked the question: Will King Charles be the 'Defender of the Faith' or 'a Defender of Faith'? There is certainly enough evidence within the context of the Coronation to suggest that the future King Charles is embracing ecumenism and all faiths. As a parish community we are seeking to be more diverse and inclusive as we celebrate our multi-cultural routes.

In our readings this weekend St Peter reminds us that as Christians and believers we are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a consecrated nation, a people set apart.

The challenge is to live this. But as Christians we also have security in a kingdom that is beyond this world. Jesus reminds us in the gospel there is a place prepared for us in the Father's house. As the 'Thought for the Day' presenter, the Revd Sam Wells, so aptly expressed on Tuesday 2nd May: 'Saturday will be a huge statement of faith, faith in something beyond our own integrity and autonomy, faith that our country is more than a sum of its parts, faith that deserves our loyalty, and faith that beyond all earthly crowns and thrones, there is something or someone worthy of our life, our soul, our all.'

This is our faith, the faith of our Church and we are proud to profess it in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Amen.


