## **Yesterday has gone, tomorrow is in the hands of God, live for today**

Today we are presented with a number of accounts of deep faith and trust. We can only marvel at these men and women: Abraham, with Isaac and Jacob who left all that they had to go to a land to which God was calling them; Sarah who was beyond child bearing age confident that the Lord would give her a son; Abraham who was prepared to sacrifice his own son in obedience to God's command.

For those of us who have been part of "Called and Gifted" we would understand this charism as the gift of extraordinary faith: faith that would have expectations and confidence in the seemingly impossible (only possible to God) but more than that: ultimate trust that God will provide.

The common theme and thread in each of these accounts is the hope of greater things and ultimately in the Kingdom of God.

This leads us into the gospel message where we are extolled to focus beyond the needs and wants of today and strive to a greater hope. But we can only do this by being ready: ready to serve God at every moment of our lives and to be ready to leave everything in this world in preparation for the next.

It is so easy to put off things to tomorrow, to next week and to hope that all will take care of itself but God expects far more than that. He wants us to be on our guard every moment of every day being ready to welcome Him in whatever state of life we are in.

We are all guilty of hoping that we have a bit more time.

I find myself full of good intentions with my lists of all that I need to do or people I need to contact, but the lists get bigger: putting off is not what God wants. He wants me to be ready now and to action those things that He has put on my heart today.

A number of us continue to work on the responses from the synod: a synod for the people; to listen to the appeals of those who do not feel listened to, to the alienated and those on the edge and to action their requests, not tomorrow, not next year, but today. We need to act now as people of faith drawing people into a greater hope that will last.

As I continue my day to day work supporting those who are dying, the question often asked is 'How long?'. In a secular/clinical sense it is one of the most difficult questions that we are asked and indeed to answer because God only knows. And yet, if this is pondered in the context of eternity however long is transitory and part of life's journey.

I often introduce palliative care to those who are dying by explaining that it is a not about what we cannot do, i.e., take away the illness or add years to life expectancy. It is about what we can do: ensuring that people can be cared for where they want to be, surrounded by those they love.

Today's gospel speaks to us of how we can be prepared for our entry into the Kingdom of God: by being ready, accepting God's will and trusting in His infinite goodness.

## What's going on?

**Our new parents need you!** Do you enjoy meeting new people and making them feel welcome? Are you able to come and support our young families in the church and talk to them about Baptism?

**Communion Under both kinds:** "The Bishops Conference have been asked to look into the possible resumption of the reception of Holy Communion under both kinds to the congregation. Having taken advice from Professor Jim McManus, it was thought that it would not be prudent to resume this at the moment, but that this would be kept under review as further research becomes available. It was noted that most parishes are taking sensible options over the Sign of Peace where nods rather than shaking hands were becoming more commonplace. It was noted that clergy could decide for themselves if they wished to continue to wear face masks to distribute Holy Communion."

As many of us know from this Friday (5th Aug) Southampton, Winchester, Andover and the Isle of Wight will be under a **Temporary Use Ban** as Southern Water urgently works to reduce the demand on the River Test and River Itchen.

Last month we focused on 'water use', so hopefully some of the ideas we discussed will help us to be responsible as we lessen our water use to help with these efforts.

The average daily use is 450 million litres of water a day, but in July this rose to an average of 631 million. Couple this with the dry spell we are experiencing... no wonder we are in a tricky position!
