Living and dying with the certainty of the resurrection.

We have journeyed with Christ through His passion, and many of us have faithfully followed the Way of the Cross on a Friday or Sunday evening. In the words of Clarence Enzler, 'Christ Speaks: "These fourteen steps that you have taken I have walked with you. Though you are you, and I am I, yet we are truly one, one Christ, and therefore My way of the cross two thousand years ago, and your way now are also one. But note the difference. My life was incomplete until I crowned it with My death. Your fourteen steps will only be complete when you have crowned them with your life. Go now! Take up your cross and with your life complete your way!"'*

The number of stations can vary but on the majority of evenings we stopped at the fourteenth with Jesus being taken down from the Cross. Today we celebrate the most important feast of our faith with a God who faces death frankly but protests about the finality of death. On that first Easter morning Mary and the disciples are greeted by an empty tomb, and a God who refuses to leave the dead forever dead. The Father does not leave Jesus to rest in peace, He gives death no permission to hold Jesus ransom to those who caused His death. Today we celebrate the memory of God's great act of raising Jesus from the dead and trust that our own death will not be the final word.

I am privileged to accompany individuals as they make their final journey from life into death and beyond. It is not unusual to witness a moment of recognition or awareness as individuals take their final breath. It is as if they have seen something or someone or have a vision of where they are heading.

Over the last couple of months, several of us have attended the funerals of two outstanding Christian individuals who have faithfully followed their way of the cross in sickness and in infirmity. Two women who had a deep, deep faith in their risen Lord. Before Gina died, her final acclamation was 'I have seen the Lamb!'. The Lamb of God who had fed her daily and weekly through the Eucharist and was now there to bring her home.

Liz had a rapid illness and spent the last few weeks of her life bed bound and unable to move. As Liz neared the end of her life, she lost her sight and couldn't see but she didn't stop trusting. She spoke powerfully about her belief that Jesus was her stretcher bearer and was carrying her towards Heaven. Shortly before she died, she wrote a text message to her parish priest saying, 'I have found Him, He is walking alongside me as one of my stretcher bearers carrying me home.'

These two moving accounts give us great encouragement that the resurrected Jesus is waiting for us. He is with us in life but has promised that He will also be with us in death.

It is customary for us to message one another as a New Year begins to wish each other a 'Happy New Year'. As Easter Morning breaks, can I encourage you to message your friends and family and say 'Christ is risen, Alleluia!' and they will reply 'He is risen indeed!'.

Divine Mercy Sunday Devotions in St Edmund's 3pm 16th.

All are warmly invited to take part in the small gathering. It is important to remember that this message of the Divine Mercy, revealed to St. Faustina and to our present God is and has been from the very beginning. This truth that God is in His very nature Love and Mercy Itself, is given to us by our faith and God's self-revelation. The veil that has hidden the mystery of God from eternity was lifted by God Himself. In His goodness and love God chose to reveal Himself to us and to make known His eternal plan of salvation. In the person of Jesus Christ, conceived through power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary, the unseen God was made visible. When St. Pope John Paul canonized Sr Faustina, he also, on the same day, surprised the entire world by establishing Divine Mercy Sunday (the feast day associated with the message) as a feast day for the entire Church. The feast day falls on the Second Sunday of the Easter season. On that day, John Paul II declared, "This is the happiest day of my life."
