THE TRUEST IDENTITY OF GOD - GENTILITY & HUMILITY

Two weeks ago, as I was preparing to celebrate Sunday Mass, the Bishop rang me and asked if I could have a meeting with him at the Bishop's House in Portsmouth. As I drove to Portsmouth that day, I knew I had not undermined the priesthood in anyway to warrant a disciplinary meeting with the Bishop; I knew he was meeting to inform me of my new appointment which I have been expecting. After Bishop Philip had announced the appointment to me, given me a little background to why he made the decision and sworn me to an oath of secrecy, I was elated at the trust he reposed in me and excited about such a new chapter in my life. When I asked my Spiritual Director to guide me on the best approach to adopt, he paused for some moments and said to me - LISTEN TO EVERYONE, BE GENTLE IN YOUR APPROACH AND WALK HUMBLY LIKE JESUS THE GOOD SHEPHERD.

My Spiritual Director then reminded me that the Bishop is sending me to Fleet and Church Crookham, to be a Father to everyone especially those on the peripheries and those who have been outsiders to the Church; he then asked me to be a Bridge-Builder and Mender.

In our Sunday Readings this week, we encounter Jesus Christ who rejoices with His Father for hiding the truest identity of God from those with "Special Knowledge -Gnostics" and revealing it to those of "Childlike Minds - Nepios". This truest identity of God is that of gentility and humility of heart. Yes, our God walks alongside us, bears our burdens with us, understands all the ups and downs of our lives, and feels our pains without being aloof to them. It is this exact vision of God that Prophet Zechariah talked about in today's First Reading, that our God who is the King of Kings would come to us triumphantly but humbly to proclaim peace to the whole world. One wonders why there are so many crusades, fights, discriminations and exploitations around the world all in the name of God. One wonders why we need to fight "God's Battles" when He has no need of them. One wonders why there is so much power-intoxicated people in our parishes and governments when we have been called to serve in gentility and humility. One thing is sure, if we take refuge in the gentle and humble heart of Jesus, we will find relaxation, recreation and rejuvenation. As I prepare to depart the wonderful parish of City Centre Southampton with its amazing people, pray for me to become a listening, gentle and humble parish priest who includes everyone and not just a selected few. JESUS, MEEK AND HUMBLE OF HEART - MAKE OUR HEARTS LIKE UNTO THINE!!!
