Who is my neighbour ?

Neighbours in the conventional sense are those geographically near to us or linked to us through twinning or a something in common.

But the neighbours that Jesus refers to in this Sunday's gospel are very different to this. Jesus challenges us to reach out to those on the edges, the marginalised, those with no voice. These are the people that we were encouraged to reach out to when we are looking at our synodal process. They have a voice and they have so much to teach us from the place where they are coming from.

Pope Francis in his encyclical Evangelli Guadium exhorted us to smell of the sheep, to minister in the ditches, to be a field hospital for all who are lost. There is an account of a journalist who was spending time with Mother Theresa in the slums of Calcutta. He walked the streets with her trying to get a sense of her work and her mission. At one point the reporter lost Mother Theresa, he retraced his steps, looked to the left and the right but she was nowhere to be found. What he has failed to do was to look down. Mother Theresa was in the gutter on her hands and knees ministering to those on the ground. Mother Theresa lived her charisms of Love and Mercy. The psalmist tells us that the commandments of God should be written on our hearts: they should be part of our very being.

I was speaking to a priest recently about our relationship with the LGBT community. As I sought to gain a deeper understanding of what my response should be he pulled me up and asked me why I referred to members of this community as 'them' or 'they'. Surely he said, they are us. He was absolutely right. We are all children of God and there should be no differentiation. We are constantly told about 'others': the refugees, asylum seekers, the unemployed. It should not be us and them: we are all the children of God and they are our neighbours.

In the gospel we are presented with three persons: two of them passed by without stopping to help. It is all too easy to find excuses as to why we should not be the person to assist. We are being asked at this time to respond to 'Closer to Christ': to support our Catholic Home Care charity, our own buildings and the training and support of our clergy. The good Samaritan gave in abundance: can we respond in a similar way to those in our community supported by Catholic Home Care and our priests who serve us? Who are our neighbours?

Weekly Green Living Suggestions...

Thanks to all who are bringing in **foil for recycling.** Hampshire Refilleries kindly collects this from us. A reminder: all foil items to be **washed** and **flattened**....

Sadly **we can no longer collect coloured plastic bottle tops** as the places who were collecting from us are no longer able to do so. If anyone knows of anywhere that still offers this recycling service please email in!

This month we are focusing on **ways to save water**, and the good news is we can all do it!

Some simple things we could do are things like **fixing drips, leaks and overflows** - we often put off these small tasks, but a tap that drips each second can waste as much as 4-5 litres in a day... that's nearly enough to fill a bath!

Although not practical for everyone, some of us could collect the 'run off' from when we leave the tap running to get the water just cold enough to drink, or hot enough to use. Saving this water for use in the house or garden is a great way to prevent waste. It is all too easy to just let the water run down the plughole until it becomes hot enough!!
