




City Centre Catholic Parish Southampton



Last weekend we reflected on the abundant generosity of God and this weekend we are presented with Gods limitless patience. Our gospel will resonate with many of us, keen to serve God and others, keen to say yes but without a heartfelt commitment and then finding that we fail to commit or follow through. Jesus' words touch the core of what it is to be human. However, He requires of each one of us something beyond that and a way of life that is transformational and sustaining. The prophet Ezekiel reminds us that we are called to a life of integrity, the ability to recognise our sin and turn away from it. This is the heart of the gospel message. Jesus understands our weakness and propensity to fail but is always there to give us a second chance. He challenges religiosity, those who sign up to something because they feel they ought to and yet have no conviction or depth or sustainability. What the Lord requires is humility, openness of heart and the willingness to turn around. St Benedict in his rule demonstrates this with the ladder of humility. Our lives are the sides and in order to progress we must climb down. Stepping down and recognising our limitations moves us toward God, climbing is a movement towards praise and self-aggrandisement.

The Lord is always ready to give us a second chance. It doesn't matter how often we fail, He wants us to turn around. He is ready to welcome us as the Father who welcomed the prodigal son. As well as abundant generosity there is limitless patience and just as it is never too late to enter the vineyard, it is never too late to turn around.

St Augustine is a counterpart to the son in the gospel who was late in doing his father's will. Augustine's early life was characterised by a refusal to follow the gospel. In his Confessions he admits his wayward ways and sexual exploits but also recognises the tardiness of his decision.

Augustine writes 'Late have I loved Thee, O Beauty so ancient and so new, late have I loved Thee....thou didst call and cry out and burst in upon my deafness, thou didst shine forth and glow and drive away my blindness...and now I pant for Thee.. thou didst touch me and I was inflamed with desire for Thy peace.'

There is always hope and the challenge for each one of us is to model the patience and persistence of our Heavenly Father and to welcome the late comer, whilst recognising the propensity in each one of us that our performance may not always match our promise.
