# BLESSED CARLO ACUTIS & THE EUCHARISTIC MIRACLES

On the 10th of October 2020, a remarkable history was made in the Catholic Church when the 15-year-old Carlo Acutis was beatified, that is, proclaimed "BLESSED", by Pope Francis represented by Cardinal Agostino Vallini at St Francis Basilica, Assisi. Blessed Carlo Acutis broke all the records the Church had hitherto held onto regarding saints; he was not only a teenager when he died, he was a computer geek (A nerd) who loved and played lots of video games; at school, he defended children with special needs and those whose parents had gone through a divorce. However, the most central part of Blessed Carlo Acutis' life was his profound devotion to Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. After making his First Holy Communion when he was 7, Blessed Carlo went to Mass every day and spent time contemplating Jesus in the tabernacle. As an 11-year-old lad, he started visiting countries, churches, shrines, and designated places where Eucharistic Miracles had occurred, and he documented them digitally and painstakingly. He then used his computer wizardry to create and launch a website where all the Eucharistic Miracles around the world could be accessed, studied and contemplated -

Blessed Carlo Acutis was so inflamed with Eucharistic Love that he always told everyone that "the Eucharist is my highway to Heaven. The more often we receive the Eucharist, the more we will become like Jesus, so that on this earth we will have a foretaste of heaven".

On this Solemnity of Corpus Christi, Christ reminds us that He is the replacement of the Old Testamental Manna and encourages us to eat His Flesh and drink His Blood. Christ used the Greek word Trogo meaning to gnaw/nibble persistently, and the Greek word Sarx which is the human flesh that is prone to selfish acts/motives and decay, to show how desperate He wants us to approach Him in the Holy Eucharist for the redemption of our bodies and souls. To us the hungry and thirsty, He in the Eucharist gives Himself to eat and drink. To us the sinners and guilty, He in the Eucharist grants His mercy and pardon. To us the entrapped and defenceless, the weak, and the sick, He in the Eucharist grants deliverance and protection, security of life and healing of mind and body. God in the Eucharist cares completely for us. With St Thomas Aquinas we say: "In Sanctissimo Sacramento, Adoramus Te, Domine. In Spiritu et Veritate, Adoramus Te, Domine".
