REJOICE, FOR TEN THOUSAND DIFFICULTIES DO NOT MAKE ONE DOUBT

In 2007, the New York publication company - Doubleday, published the book - "Mother Teresa: Come Be My Light", which shocked the whole world. This book contains the private writings of Mother Teresa to her spiritual advisors over several years. What shocked the world regarding the book, was the revelation that Saint Teresa of Calcutta had been battling with SPIRITUAL DARKNESS/SPIRITUAL ARIDITY/DARK NIGHT OF THE SOUL for nearly 50 years, from 1949/50 till her death in 1997. To make matters worse, even those closest to her did not notice she was suffering internally and spiritually. In one of the correspondences published in that book, Mother Teresa wrote: "The pain within is so great... Please ask Our Lady to be my Mother in this darkness. The place of God in my soul is blank - There is no God in me. In the darkness... Lord, my God, who am I that You should forsake me? The darkness is so dark, and I am alone." Mother Teresa prayed for her spiritual darkness to be lifted; however, she accepted her cross, resigned herself to God's will and stated: "The greater the pain and the darker the darkness, the sweeter will be my smile."

In today's Gospel Reading, we encounter the same 'Spiritual Darkness' in John the Baptist who sent his disciples to ask Christ one crucial question – "Are you the Expected One or are we to expect another?". Although John the Baptist was the precursor of Christ and a close family relation of Jesus, he had his doubts on whether Christ was the REAL DEAL or not. Christ answered the question by asking John's messengers to bring glad tidings (Apagello) back to him that the prophecies of Isaiah 61:1; 29:18 and 35:5 are being fulfilled in Him. These same glad tidings are echoed in today's First Reading from Proto-Isaiah encouraging the Israelites to rejoice and exult in their present condition for God was coming to save them, heal their sick and restore their glory. My friends, on this Gaudete Sunday, with the example of John the Baptist, we are reminded that our closeness to God does not exonerate us from sufferings, pains, and doubts; however, amid the many turbulences of our lives, like Mother Teresa of Calcutta, we should always heed the words of St James in today's Second Reading to be patient and never lose heart. As Christ stated today – Blessed are those who are not scandalised by His style of servant leadership.

Gaudete in Domino Semper - Rejoice in the Lord always!!!

- 1. Does God always come into your life the way you expect? John the Baptist (Gospel) might have expected a mighty one and was confused by the gentle, healing Jesus. Was he called to conversion? Can Advent be a time of conversion for us to recognise new or different ways Jesus comes into our lives?
- 2. Reflecting on Isaiah's words (1st reading), who does God use to transform the world now? Is there anything you could do, small or large, in the areas of racial or ecological justice, or of ending the war in Ukraine?
- 3. St James (2nd reading) writes about patience: What are some qualities that patience brings with it? What does impatience bring? St James warns his community about complaining about one another. Is this a fault peculiar to James' community? How does it relate to patience?
