Shopping local and shopping seasonal is best for the planet. Perhaps try and shop at farm shops or independent greengrocers with local suppliers. Just search online for '**Veg boxes Southampton**' and a whole range of places present themselves.

NB. Take care with your plastic recycling. Most plastic will have the triangular symbol which means it is recyclable BUT Southampton and Hampshire do not currently have the facility to recycle anything plastic that isn't shaped like a bottle! If you put anything else in the bin it contaminates the whole lot and it will end up in landfill.
