





IF YOU LOVE ME, KEEP MY COMMANDMENTS!!!

On the 10th of May 2023, the first batch of priests and deacons working in our diocese gathered in Basingstoke for their Annual Safeguarding Training. This is a mandatory training for any clergy who wants to continue in active ministry in our diocese. Among the many videos we were shown was a video testimony of Johnny who as a young man was very devoted to God and the Church; however, his entire world collapsed when he was abused by a priest whom he trusted, admired, and looked up to. Although Johnny is in his late 40s presently and has gone through a lot of healing processes, at one point in the video, he broke down, wept bitterly, and said - 'he took my human dignity and has condemned me to a life of sorrow'. As I watched the video, I was enraged due to the indescribable suffering Johnny has been subjected to due to the despicable action of an ordained minister. I wanted to reach out to Johnny and apologise that a church that should have been his safest space, turned out to be his worst nightmare. I equally wanted to ask the perpetrator why he inflicted such an unforgettable wound on such an innocent soul, and it dawned on me that the perpetrator and others like him have no clear comprehension of Genuine Love.

In this Sunday's Gospel which is part of Christ's Last Discourse with His disciples, He told them – "If you love me, you will keep my commandments." Although God's love is there for all of us and unmerited, it behooves on us to respond to it before it becomes active in our lives. One crucial way to respond to God's love is to keep His Commandments which is to love Him and to love our neighbours. If we truly love God, we will never abuse anyone in our churches. If we truly love God, we will never abuse the poor, needy, homeless, migrants, beggars, and the marginalised. For us to truly love God, we need Allon Parakleton – Another Helper/Advocate, in the person of the Holy Spirit. Like the people of Samaria in today's First Reading, let us await His descent with open minds and hearts.
