What do we expect of Heaven?

"A banquet of rich food and a banquet of fine wines" (Isaiah)

A very good friend of mine is a fantastic cook. Whenever big celebratory days arrive like Easter or Christmas he always arranges the most amazing food. He is, of course, Italian; and like many Italians he is a very good cook and knows a thing or two about wine tasting. His favourite line that he would offer after grace was "all this and Heaven". In other words, God has given us all this and we have Heaven to look forward too.

How often are we told that we don't know what Heaven will be like, it is a mystery. Yet the bible is full of descriptions. Take today's readings for example, the readings compare Heaven to that of a banquet or a feast. Sometimes it is described as a mountain, we climb the mountain and when we reach the peak all suffering and mourning is removed, like a veil. In today's Gospel Heaven is described as a wedding. These are joyful occasions.

I do think Heaven is a mystery but the writers who describe Heaven, including Jesus Himself, are trying to use our senses in describing this place of mystery: using food we like to awaken tastebuds, using mountains to engage our eyes, having the smell of aged wine to fill us with melancholy. We must remember that the fullness of this joy comes at the top of the mountain. We experience glimpses of it here on earth, but there are always peaks and troughs throughout our lives.

We can't fully know what Heaven is like and thanks be to God for that because it might ruin the surprise. However, there will be no suffering, we will never feel that hunger which might be physical or perhaps emotional or spiritual. This week is a chance to really engage with our senses and allow God to work with them to help us grow closer to him and then just like my friend we can say "all this and Heaven".

KEY RETURNS. We are hosting a "key amnesty" where anyone in the parish with keys they no longer need is politely invited to return them. **If you have keys to parish property you must return these to the Parish Office as soon as possible.** If you attach your name to the keys and specify why you need them going forward then they will be added to the list to consider, but otherwise you need not put your name with them. **You save the Parish money returning keys you do not need.** You can put the keys in the collection bags at Mass, send them to the Parish Office or give them to the welcomers/clergy at Mass to make their way back to the Office (if not obvious, please identify their usage!). If you have keys you use so often you cannot part with them please email the Parish Office which keys you have, or contact us to let us know.
