







# THERE IS NO CHRIST WITHOUT HIS MARKS OF CRUCIFIXION

One of my favourite paintings of all times is Salvador Dali's 'Christ of Saint John of the Cross' which is Scotland's most favourite painting. Salvador Dali sketched this painting of 'A Cosmic Christ' without any marks of suffering on His body to depict Christ's willingness to suffer and die for us. This painting presently hangs in Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum in Glasgow and is worth more than \$80 million. My love for this painting is so profound that it is one of the sacred paintings that hangs on the wall of the prayer corner in my sitting room in the presbytery. The major criticism against this painting of Salvador Dali is that IT IS TOO NEAT and a far-cry from the ordeals Christ endured because of His love for us. The marks of the crucifixion are the distinguishing marks on the body of Christ that even in heaven He bears them gallantly and triumphantly as His marks of mercy for us. Yes, there is no Christ without His marks of crucifixion.

In our readings on this Divine Mercy Sunday, we experience palpably the merciful love of Christ in the marks of His crucifixion. These marks are indelible on His Sacred Body and in today's Gospel He asked Thomas to rummage through them to resolve his unbelief. Christ endured and bears these marks of His crucifixion as a testament of His mercy for us which we hear of in today's Second Reading. My friends, we all go through lots of sufferings in the world and these sufferings leave us with scars on our bodies, souls and spirits. We should not be afraid of our scars or cover them up; each of those scars has so much influenced us to make us who we are today. God does not promise to erase them but to give us the grace to triumph over them and be victorious. Remember, those scars are our passports to heaven, and we should be proud of them.

If you are free this Sunday, why not join us at 3pm at St Edmund's Church for Divine Mercy Chaplet, Mass, and Adoration, to implore the mercies of God. May we with one heart and voice pray: For the sake of His sorrowful passion – Have mercy on us and on the whole world!

Divine Mercy Sunday Devotions in St Edmund's 3pm 16th. Confessions at 2pm, Chaplet at 3pm followed by Mass and Adoration. All are warmly invited to take part in the small gathering! This message of the Divine Mercy, revealed to St. Faustina and to our present generation is not new, it is a powerful reminder of who God is and has been from the very beginning. This truth that God is in His very nature Love and Mercy Itself, is given to us by our faith and God's self-revelation. The veil that has hidden the mystery of God from eternity was lifted by God Himself. In His goodness and love God chose to reveal Himself to us and to make known His eternal plan of salvation. In the person of Jesus Christ, conceived through power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary, the unseen God was made visible. When St. Pope John Paul canonised Sr Faustina, he also, on the same day, surprised the entire world by establishing Divine Mercy Sunday (the feast day associated with the message) as a feast day for the entire Church. The feast day falls on the Second Sunday of the Easter season. On that day, John Paul II declared, "This is the happiest day of my life."
