Being a parable for others

Stories catch our attention, they grip our imagination, they move our feelings, and we are guided by them. That is really the point about stories, they are simple in structure, and difficult to forget. The parables of Jesus are just that, unforgettable accounts about real life which do not change over time. Each parable is a homily in itself.

We are all, by virtue of our Baptisms anointed with the sacred Chrism to be Priest, Prophet and King, so that through our lives we should imitate the Christ by our preaching. Indeed, all of us are called to preach by what we do and what we say. This need not require us to pick up our soap box and stand in Southampton shopping precinct and sound off. There is a good argument that this would provide, at best, a few minutes of entertainment for the spectators and no convincing testimony to the Truth who is God.

But we have listened to the Gospels, we have heard the Truth, and it has been explained to us all. We can learn all this for ourselves, then, quietly, and blessedly, learn to share it with people we may know. Perhaps people who would well have had none of it until we had shown them something of it. The Spirit of God has taught us to be as Jesus, meek and humble of heart, never 'holier than thou', like the poor Pharisees who sacrificed love for the sake of rules. We have parables to tell, maybe, of our failures, our sufferings, our embarrassments, and our joys; and most importantly what we have learned from them.

There is good, there is so much good in our faith filled lives. We surely must have stories to tell, of good things done by good people whom we know. Might we even have good things to tell them about, in all modesty, good things done by ourselves in the exercise and praise of our faith all emulating from He who was the first parable?

What's going on?

Thank you to all who attended Mass at the 6.15pm in St Joseph's & the 11am in St Edmund's last weekend and who took part in our fire drills. Both churches took just over 2 minutes to empty which was a positive number! Some notes to remember...

- In the event of a fire do not bring your hymn books and sheets to the back of church as you exit. This causes some clogging at the porch which blocks the doors. All possessions should be left in the pews where you were sitting to be collected only when you are told it is safe to do so.
- Remember there are **two exits to each church** both via the front door and through the sacristy. If you are sitting at the front of the church it would make more sense that you exit through the sacristy exits as this helps cut down the time it takes to empty the church. However, if you have mobility issues and sit near the front you should try exit via the front doors to avoid the steps if they present a challenge to you.

We aim to have fire drills at the 10am and the 9am and 7pm at some point in the future so do keep these points in mind.

Did the excitement of the fire drills make you want to get involved in health and safety in the parish? Great! We are still looking for volunteers to check exits, check emergency lights and test fire alarm call points periodically. These tests should really be done weekly and so if we can build a good number of volunteers we hope that this would become something you do only every 6 weeks or so. Please get in touch with Anna to discuss if you feel able to help the Parish in this way:)

With pollution levels high in our waterways why not try using some natural cleaning solutions to help out?

In the Kitchen you can keep your fridge fresh and clean by using 1tsp of bicarbonate of soda in hot water. Remove limescale from your kettle with distilled white vinegar and leave overnight. The Brown Door keys at St Joseph's have been changed!!!! We are trying to come up with a full list of key holders and so are asking that everyone with a key returns the key to a member of the clergy before the 20th July. If you could put your name with the key on/in an envelope then we can match up who needs the new keys. If you need your key returned before the 27th July then just call Anna to say you have the key. The new lock will be used from the weekend of the 29th July and so if you have not returned your old key you won't be able to get in the building!!!!
