Being a Labourer at the Harvest

We all know that the meaning of the word Gospel is Good News. Paul Gilbert once wrote: "You are writing a gospel a Chapter each day by the deeds that you do, and the words that you say. People read what you write, if it's false or it's true. Now what is the gospel according to you?" The apostles writing the Gospels had their own understanding of what gospel is all about according to what they experienced.

In today's Gospel Jesus appoints twelve of His disciples as His apostles. But St Peter also wrote and is quoted in the prayers at Baptism: "You are a chosen race a royal priesthood...". In other words, all of us, without exemption, is called to be a preacher and a missionary of the gospel.

Sometimes in the past, the work of evangelising or sharing our faith by preaching was regarded as belonging only to bishops, priests and deacons. But now it is different, now we recognise our roots as a Christian community of sisters and brothers all dedicated to the same work and all cooperating closely and together. Each of us need contribute in our own way to the common good of our parish and the Church as a whole.

How we might ask. Well, by getting involved, there is enough work for us all, and then still more. If your gift is singing, then join one of our choirs; if you are creative then join the flower arranging team; if you like a tidy home then join the Marthas and the church cleaning team; if you like helping others understand then join one of the many teams of catechists (teachers); if you find satisfaction in consoling and supporting the bereaved then join the Bethany Group; if you like joining with others and discussing our faith then join a Cell Group or Alpha; and the list goes on. It is truly endless.

Everyone is called to share their time, talent and treasure (the 3 Ts) no matter how small it may seem. Let's be good examples to all. As somebody once said, good example helps people, bad example breaks them.

People learn about God and His Gospel not because they can unravel the mystery of the Trinitarian God or they are well versed with scripture. People will know about God from Christ-like people, from Christians who live out the gospel in their lives.

This year the theme is 'Listen to Her' focusing on post-abortion trauma and the impact of abortion primarily on women, but also men and others.
