BUYING HEAVEN ANYONE?

In 1517, the German Monk – Friar Martin Luther, published his 95 Theses on the chapel door of the University of Wittenberg, which started what we now call – The Protestant Reformation. The last straw that pushed him into that was the preaching of Fr Johann Tetzel on gaining of Indulgences. Johann Tetzel who was commissioned by the German Cardinal Albert of Brandenburg, overstated and overexaggerated the Church's teaching on Indulgences. According to Tetzel, "As soon as the gold in the casket rings, the rescued soul to heaven springs." Friar Martin Luther who could not comprehend such a ludicrous theology, published his 95 Theses denouncing it. On Thesis 43, Luther stated, "Christians should be taught that one who gives to the poor, or lends to the needy, does a better action than if he/she purchases indulgences." What a delight the Church condemned the teachings of Tetzel and reformed her stance on Indulgences, stressing our bounden duty to the poor and the marginalised.

In today's Sunday readings, we are reminded of the fact that we have been entrusted with enormous resources and we, as managers (Oikonomos) of those resources should do so intelligently (Phronimos) for the betterment of the poor and not for our personal enrichment and/or aggrandisement. Prophet Amos in the First Reading advised us not to trample on the needy and the poor; and never to accumulate profits by cheating our way through. In the Gospel, Jesus advised us to use money to win friends that will welcome us into the tents of eternity because He wants everyone to be saved and reach the full knowledge of the truth as St Paul stated in our Second Reading. How can money win us friends and gain us the tents of eternity? St Mother Teresa of Calcutta answered it thus: "At the end of our lives, we will not be judged by how many diplomas we have received, how much money we have made, how many great things we have done. We will be judged by - I was hungry, and you gave me something to eat, I was naked, and you clothed me. I was homeless, and you took me in." Yes, the era of buying heaven through paying huge sums of money for Indulgences is gone; however, the poor, the needy, the homeless and the marginalised members of our society, are our tickets to heaven.
