# Emmanuel. God With Us.



As we move into the final week of Advent and nearer and nearer to the great feast of Christmas, our readings this weekend draw us into the reality of what this means for each one of us. The gospel acclamation is succinct and clear: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a Son, and they will call Him Emmanuel which means 'God is with us'.

This is a moment and a cause for not only the celebration of the feast but for the recognition of His presence in the human family. 'God with us' is not simply the acknowledgement of His first coming but a recognition that as He comes to dwell with each one of us we have a responsibility to one another and we become part of each other's lives. Christmas is about our social life within the community.

As we witness on a daily basis those who are destitute, those who are in need, those who are impoverished, it is at this time more than ever that we need to work with and not against one another but as part of each other, as one family. God not only draws all men to Himself but in His presence draws us into one another. As much as He shares in our sufferings, our hurts and our frustrations, we need to do this for our brothers and sisters. We need to feel and share in the pain of families who have lost loved ones through tragic accidents, illness or violence.

While we rejoice at the prospect of having God amongst us we also need to recognise the responsibility of living in the presence of God. It is not something that we can simply celebrate for a day or a season. God is here to stay. The psalmist cries 'Let the Lord enter!'

With presence not only comes responsibility but the call to witness with our lives. Mary opened herself up to the gift of the Holy Spirit and the indwelling of the Christ child. Mary was not only the mother of God but the first disciple and witness of the incarnation. St Paul reminds us that this grace has also been poured into our lives and we in turn are called to belong to Jesus Christ and should place ourselves and our lives at His service.

'Hence the Church in her apostolic work also rightly looks to her who brought forth Christ, conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin, so that through the Church Christ may be born and grow in the hearts of the faithful also.' Vatican II, Constitution on the Church, 1964:65

Christmas is a time to echo the words of the angel as she appeared to Joseph 'She will give birth to a son and you must name him Jesus, because he is the one to save his people from their sins' Now is not the time for us as a community to play hide and seek with God.

We must declare for all to hear and see Emmanuel, God is with us'

## Green Living Update...

A recent Vatican newsletter (24/11/2022) presented some ideas for the care of Our Common Home. One of the things discussed was the Slow Food movement. https://www.slowfood.com This is an organisation that promotes local food and traditional cooking, small businesses, and sustainable foods. It focuses on quality rather than quantity. It speaks out against overproduction and food waste, educating and inspiring people to support better agricultural policies which allow us to cultivate the land without exploiting it using organic techniques and methods. One very simple thing we could consider is returning to the habit of not eating meat on Friday. (Some of us have never stopped doing this.) This would be a thoughtful way of remembering that the production of red meat, particularly beef, is one of the threats to many ecosystems such the Amazon rainforest which is still being felled at an alarming rate for the farming of beef cattle or the production of soya for cattle feed among other things.
