Mother of Our Lord and Model for us all

Mary, during her life on earth gave us the ultimate example of what it is to be Mother. She was totally open to conception and rejoiced with her cousin as the child leapt in her womb.

She carried the Christ child with fidelity and patience, nurturing the Son of God in her womb.

She gave birth, swaddling the child in a manger. Mary supported and encouraged Jesus through His childhood and adolescence, as any mother would; presenting Him at the temple and listening to His teachings. Mary experienced the pain of separation; when a young adult leaves the family home and makes their own way, but she endured the ultimate sacrifice when she saw her son crucified and a 'sword pierced her heart'.

Mary not only teaches us how to parent our children, she teaches us how to prepare for and welcome the Christ child into our hearts and lives.

Mary was conceived without sin and was overshadowed by the Holy Spirit when she was told that she was to be the Mother of God. She conceived the Son of God by the Holy Spirit and was assumed by that same Spirit at the end of her earthly life.

She received the Word made flesh into her womb, pondered on the Word and lived by the Word. As we approach the re-coming, re-birthing of Our Lord and Saviour we are invited to imitate Mary in her preparation and reception of the Christ child.

Ronald Rolheiser the author and oblate master reminds us 'Like Mary, we need to get pregnant by the Holy Spirit. We need to let the Word take such root in us that it begins to become part of our actual flesh. ...we need to nurture what is growing inside us... and eventually to give birth. ...Birth is only the beginning of motherhood, it is the process of giving birth to faith in the world' (1).

A number of us from our Alpha journey gathered last weekend to focus on the Holy Spirit: who He is, His gifts and how we can ask for and receive the Holy Spirit into our lives. It was a powerful gathering and many of us came away excited, empowered and filled. The Holy Spirit can do amazing thing if we let Him!

By that same Spirit may we all have the courage to invite the Word made flesh to dwell, to be born and to be shared. Come Lord Jesus!

Bamenda. On behalf of the Portsmouth Bamenda Committee, Colm Lennon writes to thank parishioners for your generosity in this year's Bamenda Sunday collection...

The Portsmouth Bamenda Committee would like to say a big thank you to the people of the Diocese for their generous donations following Bamenda Sunday. Whilst we are still awaiting details relating to the Sunday collection there was a significant increase in using the donate button along with standing orders. The addition of these funds to our general account has enabled us to send to Bamenda a total of £83,500 for a variety of projects in the fields of Health, Social Welfare and Education.

On the Health front projects include provision of PPE for health care workers, hospital equipment, rehabilitation of physically disabled children and a hospital incinerator.

Our Social Welfare projects include provision of water supply, funding the Justice and Peace program and assisting teenage single mothers.

Now that schools are being reopened after some 4 years, funds have been allocated to provide education for orphans and vulnerable children. Additional funding has also been set aside for rebuilding and expansion of classrooms.

The political crisis in Bamenda continues, along with Covid-19, to cause great suffering to the people of Bamenda. Your generous donations, along with your prayers, enable us to reach out to our brothers and sisters there to help them in their time of need. In the coming months we will provide progress reports on the various projects being supported.
