Kingship

The solemnity of Christ the King was instituted as the solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ King of the Universe by Pope Pius XI in 1925. The Pope asserted that the most effective defence against the destructive forces of the age is the recognition of the Kingship of Christ.

We are reminded that at our Baptism we are anointed with holy oil as prophet, priest and king.

The feast of Christ the King is a good opportunity not only to reflect on the Kingship of Christ but on our kingship and what it means to be a king.

Understanding the feast helps us to to understand our own call better. St Ignatius in his spiritual exercises encourages us to reflect on the call of the King and what it means today.

At this present time of climate crisis and destruction it is poignant to revisit the creation story and to recognise that each one of us were given the gift of this beautiful world. 'And God said: Behold I have given you every herb bearing seed upon the earth and all the trees that have in themselves seeds of their own kind and to every fowl of the air and to all that move upon the earth and wherein there is life that they may had to feed upon. And so it was done'. The responsibility of a king is to care for his subjects and we were called to be the custodians of creation.

The King of the Universe shows us how far this responsibility takes us in His example as ruler of all and servant of all: He rules in triumph and He rules from the Cross.

We should be asking ourselves the question over whom or what am I king and who or what have I been called to serve.

This week Cop27 has been taking place in Egypt. World leaders have gathered together to discuss and debate how we can address this current climate crisis. This crisis is due to a collective and corporate failure to care for the planet that we were given. A number of us joined with the parishioners of Avenue St Andrews last Friday to watch a film 'The Letter' written to address the encyclical Laudato Si. In the film

Pope Francis describes how the encyclical came about and we hear about the reaction to its publication. The film's protagonists represent four voices from the world's peripheries deeply impacted by climate change: Senegal, India, the Brazilian Amazon and the USA. These human stories illustrate how our planetary crisis is taking a toll on people, animals and nature: the whole of God's creation that was given to us to steward. It was very moving to watch and impossible to walk away and do nothing.

This Sunday reminds us of an eternal kingship, one to which we are all called and as St Paul reminds us one in which a place has been created for us.

But, as the opening prayer says: God is willing that His kingdom is restored and set free.

If we respond to the call of Christ the King, surely it must be to restore the harmony and beauty to this planet.

Questions to Ponder

- 1. According to Pope Francis, from the beginning of His life to His last act, Jesus revealed Himself as Mercy. What does that mean to you? What does His assurance to the good thief confirm?
- 2. Both Jesus (in the gospels) and David (1st reading) are called shepherds, anointed ones, and kings. What is the difference between their kingships?
- 3. "He is the image of the invisible God. All things in heaven and earth were created in Him, through Him and for Him" we hear in the 2nd reading. How can we heal, in Him, the wounds of the environment?



Thank you to all who supported the Rotary Shoebox Appeal this year. It has been another successful year with nearly 1000 boxes collected from Magna Rotary supporters. In total, 18,207 boxes were collected across the Wessex District. We hope you found the new system of supplied boxes beneficial, they allowed for a standardisation of packing meaning more boxes could be sent per container. Many of the boxes were beautifully decorated with colouring, stickers or wrapping paper.

Lorries will be heading off to Albania, Montenegro, Moldova and Romania very shortly. The Ukrainian clubs in Lviv and Kyiv have said that they are unable to distribute to orphanages etc in Ukraine as they are all extremely busy arranging shelters for tens of thousands of their population needing support. However, Rotary colleagues in Moldova and Romania will make sure that those boxes will get to Ukrainian children who are refugees in their countries. A huge thank you to everyone who donated shoeboxes, additional contents and knitwear.

There is now a new funding stream that helps improve the energy efficiency rating of some of Southampton's lowest-performing properties. The **Government's Sustainable Warmth programme** awards grants to home owners who might not otherwise be able to afford the necessary large-scale heating and insulation measures such as loft and wall insulation, air source heat pumps and even solar panels, to keep their homes warm in winter and cool in summer.

Successful applicants (including Landlords) will need to meet specific eligibility criteria relating to their household income and property's Energy Performance Certificate, but home owners who are eligible for the scheme will not be required to pay.
