

My Lord and my God

In 1989 Norman Autton wrote, "We often talk about the way we talk, and we frequently try to see the way we see, but for some reason we have rarely touched on the way we touch". Touch is the first sense to develop, from no sensation at 7½ weeks after conception to almost the whole body being touch sensitive by 14 weeks gestation. The essence and uniqueness of touch is its ability to communicate with others without the use of words. It is through our use of touch that we can silently convey, "I am with you and I am prepared to stay." Indeed, when words escape us, we often touch in order to console those in despair.



Whilst sight can be deceptive, as we might suggest when we say that someone is 'seeing things', touch is a more concrete way of being present to each other. Of our five physical senses, touch is the only one where we directly experience someone else's body at one and the same time. Thomas wanted to be able to see and touch not simply any part of Jesus but the wounds - the holes which were absences of flesh showing the presence of the flesh of the crucified Christ.

We, who have not seen yet believe, can experience the intimate closeness of the risen One, a genuine touch, in many ways, but particularly through the sacraments which are tangible expressions of His presence with us. This is not a private, individual experience enjoyed solely by those who are spiritually disposed. The risen Jesus breathes on us His disciples meaning He inspires us, and transforms us into a community which is sent out to show His mercy, His justice and His love. The intimately, visibly, tangibly present Jesus the Christ creates a community which becomes the world-wide Church in which He is always present.

The Christ has given us, in His divine mercy, our faith and the sacrament of His risen body and blood. Enlightened by them, we too can believe Jesus Christ is our Lord and our God, believing we may have life in His name. Let's share that faith with others and perhaps invite them to join with others on Alpha. It starts this coming Tuesday evening at 7pm. Currently a good number have joined! **Restored Lives.** 'The Church needs to be a safe environment where everybody is welcomed and included no matter their situations and/or circumstances in life; especially young people, women, divorced and/or remarried couples.'

In our recent Synodal survey where open, exploratory questions were asked, individuals contributed with a number of heartfelt and troubled responses. An area that we still need to work at as church and society is the way we treat those whose marriages have failed for whatever reason, and particularly where people feel alienated. If this applies to you, we have listened and want to respond.

In 3 weeks' time we are offering another opportunity for individuals to join our "Restored Lives" Course. This course helps people to recover from the experiences of divorce or relationship breakdown and rebuild self confidence. The course outlines the journey from breakdown to recovery, exploring communication, handling conflict, conflict resolution, managing other relationships and letting go.

There are six online evenings **starting on Monday 9th May (7-9pm)**. The course is founded on Christian principles but open to all. You will meet with others at different stages of broken relationships and will have the opportunity to share and explore in a safe and welcoming environment.

Weekly Green Living Suggestion...

Now might be a good time to consider reducing heat loss from your home. Older houses in particular lose a lot of heat. Do you have cavity wall insulation? Is your loft insulation thick enough? Do you have double/triple glazing? Some of these things may cost more than you can afford but little things like drawing the curtains at night (even in rooms you're not using) and making sure curtains are lined can help. Also consider installing reflectors behind radiators, see www.radflek.com; good draught exclusion and lagging on pipes and tanks. A 'rain check' on all these smaller things wouldn't go amiss before next winter. Finally, prevent draughts through unused chimneys. You can buy chimney balloons or see www.chimneysheep.co.uk - made with Herdwick wool, they are easily inserted above your fireplace keeping heat in and draughts out. This company uses a proportion of its profits to buy land and plant trees helping to reduce our carbon footprint. Also look at
