P. U. S. H. - Pray Until Something Happens!!!

It was in 2000 that my understanding of prayer changed; that change was brought about by a woman - St Teresa of Avila. Before the year 2000, my understanding of prayer was that of raising my mind and heart to God and the requesting of good things from God. Although the above teaching is great, I was only approaching God when I needed some favours from Him either for myself or for my family and friends. However, in 2000, I read the book - **Interior Castle - by St Teresa of Avila** and she stated that Prayer is a relationship between us and God and God desires us to approach Him with the good, the bad and the ugly sides of our lives. Wow!!! It took me months to wrap my head around such a simple but profound statement that God desires to be in a relationship with me as I am.

The above statement of St Teresa of Avila was made palpable to me by the lives of two great men in the Church - Venerable Archbishop Fulton Sheen and Archbishop Albert Obiefuna. While Venerable Archbishop Fulton Sheen taught me the necessity of spending quality time before the Blessed Sacrament every day; Archbishop Albert Obiefuna who was my formator in the seminary taught me how to approach God by giving me examples of how he related to God in prayer. According to him, he approaches God with everything happening around him; if he is annoyed and rattled, he takes his raw frustrations before God; if he is happy, he takes his joys before God and if he wants to make decisions, he makes them after consulting God. Yes, God desires to be in a relationship with us and prayer is a crucial means of nourishing that relationship, hence, Jesus taught us "The Our Father" as we heard in today's Gospel. Within this relationship with God, nothing concerning us is offlimits; He wants us to bring our joys, hopes, griefs and anxieties to Him as we saw Abraham bargaining with God in today's First Reading.

Is Prayer very essential? Absolutely Yes! Does God answer all prayers? Absolutely Yes!! Is His answer always a Yes? Absolutely No!!! But He gives us the grace to bear all

things.

- 2. What do you learn about Abraham in the 1st reading? What behaviour of his would you like to imitate? How important were persistence and candour to him? God and Abraham: what is each one willing to do because of this covenant?
- 3. St Paul in the 2nd reading says ".....*He has brought you to live with Him, He has forgiven us all our sins*". What does that mean to you? Is that reassuring and affirmative or frightening?

Weekly Green Living Suggestions...

Baths, showers & taps use 25% of our water. Consider showering rather than having a bath, turning taps off while soaping or brushing teeth using only what you need in the kettle or saucepan (not just filling up). We can also use buckets of soapy water to clean our car and only rinse with the hose (not needing a power hose).

We should water the garden in early mornings or evenings when it is cooler & we should fit water butts outside for garden use & only use sprinklers when necesary - e.g. when establishing new lawns although instead we could do this at rainy times of year?
