O Glorious St. Simon, you were a cousin of Jesus and a devoted follower as well. You were called "the Zealot," indicating that you were willing to give your life for your religion and your freedom as a human person. Obtain for us the grace to be willing to give our lives for Christ and to labor for the freedom and peace that only God can give. Help us to spend ourselves for God on earth and be received by him in eternal bliss in heaven.

'What do you want?'

Two weeks ago in our gospel encounter, Jesus had asked Peter and us the question "Who do you say that I am?' It is a question worth asking daily as we strive to journey deeper and deeper into our personal relationship with Christ. Our responses will differ dependant on where we are at and how we are feeling: but this is ok. The most important thing is that we are honest with ourselves and honest with Christ.

Today Jesus asks another question, this time of the blind man Bartimaeus. 'What do you want me to do for you?' The response was direct and honest 'Let me see again'. The gospel writer does not describe Jesus approaching the blind man but instead Jesus waits for the blind man to come to Him. Bartimaeus has been shouting for Jesus, so much so that those standing near the blind man ask him to be quiet. For me this so aptly describes those times of wrestling with my thoughts trying to work out in my own head and heart what is going wrong without taking my spiritual blindness to Jesus and asking Him to show me the right way forward. Bartimaeus did not ask for 'sight', he asked for the ability to see which describes a longing to see the deeper reality of life: It is to see and understand the truth about things and the truth about ourselves. Peter in his response to Christ clearly recognised the incarnate God 'You are the Christ, the Son of the living God'. Bartimaeus had the incarnate God standing before him and this is who and what he wanted to see and experience in all its fullness.

Our next Alpha Series starts this Tuesday and the title of the first session is "Is there more to life than this?". We are inviting our guests not only to come and see, but to discover in their hearts who the person of Jesus is to them. Is this invitation for me and you?

As we present our needs and hopes to God in prayer this week, may we have the courage and the faith to allow Him to show us what really matters and what He wants for each one of us.

A Few Words...

We are looking for people to be involved with 'welcoming' at Mass and also 'Mass coordinators' (to set up the altar for Mass); also Children's Liturgy of the Word (during the 9am Mass) and refreshments after the 9am and 10am (the latter has already recommenced).

I hope no one is offended by my refusal to give **Holy Communion** 'on the tongue' unless at the end of the line! This is not a matter of theology or ecclesiology but purely from a health perspective. COVID (as also with flu and colds) is an air-borne infection, so any close proximity to someone's mouth is a risk! Then cross-contamination can occur. Nevertheless, we are inviting anyone who wishes to receive on the tongue to come at the end of the Communion line (see item elsewhere).

Distribution of Holy Communion at Mass

We are gradually adjusting to life with Covid. The preferred and safest means of distributing Holy Communion continues to be on the hand. Reception of Holy Communion 'on the tongue' will now resume for those who, understandably, prefer this way of receiving.

We ask that those seeking to receive Holy Communion on the tongue come forward when the rest of the congregation has received. There is no offence intended by this distinction but a respect of the health of the minister and of the rest of the congregation. We would remind all Mass attenders of the health risks from cross contamination. This possibility is heightened when more than one person receives on the tongue!
