Weston Shore Walks:

Thursdays at 11am from the cafe at Weston Parade. A walk that lasts about 50 minutes, including a 5 minute break, along Weston Shore to admire the view. Going at a gentle pace (or slightly faster), this walk is designed for people just beginning to use walking as a way to improve their health. We'll stay on pavements and paths, and can adjust the route to suit the participants. Some of us stay for refreshments and a chat at the café after the walk. (Mixed pace 50 minute 'Get Fit' walk)

New lunchtime walk at **Riverside Park:**Every 2nd and 4th Wednesday of the month, 12 noon by the noticeboard at Bitterne Park Triangle. A gentle, lunchtime walk-and-talk of up to a mile in Riverside Park. This is a walk for adults pursuing good physical and mental health through walking together. (Gentle 40 minute Walk and Talk)

Badminton for over 55's is on Thursdays from 12-2 at the Solent University Sports Hall on East Park Terrace.

It is £2.00 per hour and racquets and shuttles are provided. It is a friendly group who can accommodate a range of abilities and experience (or lack of it).
