A life well lived and loved

Last weekend Fr Johnpromise in his homily asked us the question 'Can we buy a ticket to Heaven?' As I have pondered this over the last few days, a further question came to mind: 'Can we earn that ticket by the way we have lived and the service we have rendered'?

This last week we have experienced and shared in the most extraordinary example of someone who lived a life of exemplary service: Service to her God and service to her people. The Archbishop of Canterbury spoke of this when he reminded us that at her coronation the late Queen Elizabeth II promised a lifelong allegiance to God before anyone swore their allegiance to her or that she promised the same to her country. The message to us all throughout her life and farewell was that Queen Elizabeth will have died in the sure and certain hope that she will now be with God in Heaven.

In contrast our gospel reading this Sunday is not comfortable to hear or to read. The rich man is in a place of torment full of regret for the life he has lived and those he has ignored. Jesus makes it crystal clear that we have been given the warnings of the Old Testament prophets and the example of our modern day prophets (our late Queen) to show us how we should live our lives. Every day we come into contact with those who are socially, physically, economically impoverished and we need to respond.

The fact that 4.6 billion people throughout the nation, commonwealth and world watched the funeral service of Queen Elizabeth is a living record of all those who have witnessed what it is to model leadership that is untainted by wealth and splendor. Queen Elizabeth left a greater legacy than any of us can imagine.

Scott Hahn reminds us in his gospel reflections that today's liturgy is also a call to repentance, to heed the warning of the one who was raised from the dead. Although Queen Elizabeth was our longest reigning British monarch and had outwardly and ostensibly lived 96 selfless years, she was equally aware of her frailty and sinfulness and we were asked to pray for her soul and the forgiveness of her sins.

Our ticket to Heaven not only requires a life of love and service but an openness to repentance. Queen Elizabeth II lived and loved in the certain hope of eternal life with the Christ she loved and professed and Monday was a foretaste of the love that will be ours in the next life.

In his letter to Timothy, St Paul writes (and this could have equally been written to our late queen) "As a man/woman dedicated to God, you must aim to be saintly and religious, filled with faith and love, patient and gentle. Fight the good fight of the faith and win for yourself the eternal life to which you were called when you made your profession and spoke up for the truth in front of many witnesses".

The growth of Eucharistic adoration over the past two millennia is a beautiful example of the organic development of doctrine and of Christian life and worship. Like Mary, who kept the words of the Lord in her heart and meditated on them day and night, the Church has reflected over the centuries on her greatest treasure and the fitting homage to give to it. The second millennium has witnessed the constant growth of the personal prayer of the faithful before the Blessed Sacrament. Hopefully here in St Edmund's we will continue to see this growth!

We are created to worship God by the way we live and to give God glory through deliberate focused adoration of him and we find our ultimate fulfilment as His people when we lovingly adore Him as Mary did. Personal prayer before the Blessed Sacrament with dedicated Adoration times helps us to have discipline in this aim, and furthers our prayer life significantly.
