The Parish has now moved to sacramental sign ups via electronic forms over the internet, which has proved a great success. For all of our forms, filling in multiple times has no positive impact. If you fill in several times it means you will receive the same amount of emails (i.e., you sign up 5 times, you get 5 emails). The information does not come faster, as we only give the information when we have it!

Christmas Crib offerings to support The Knights of the Holy Sepulchre. The KHS is made up of 30,000 members from 40 countries, lay people, priests and religious who financially support Christians in the Middle East, and who, above all, pray for them. They fund many works that support the Christians living in the Holy Land, thus ensuring that they survive and that the holy sites are still populated by Christians and do not become museums. The Knights do everything they can to help with practical projects to stabilise Christian communities. The key partner for the KHS in the Holy Land is the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem and through the Patriarchate, they fundraise to maintain schools, formation, charitable and social activities.
