### Laetare! Rejoice!

Today we recognise the light that lay at the end of the tunnel, and we respond with joy and gladness. Lent is indeed about repentance, but hope is essential to true repentance. Without hope, repentance becomes futile and meaningless, lacking direction or an end. Laetare Sunday is about the hope that fuels repentance, that looks ahead to Easter and resurrection and life in order to inspire, nourish, and replenish us for the remainder of our Lenten journey.

It was quite clear to all who watched that our children on their journey toward their First Holy Communion and who made their first reconciliation last Saturday came away refreshed, shriven, and full of hope fuelled repentance.

Today's parable of the prodigal son is surely one of the most cherished stories in all of world literature, encapsulating the very spirit and essence of the Gospel message. Through the medium of story, using parables and dramatic imagery Jesus reveals Himself and His mission. Jesus will also use parables, as a means of an invitation. In the parables the truth is present in a hidden manner, lying beneath the surface. The truth is there for those willing to seek it; but is not found by those whose hearts and minds are too hardened to pursue truth and light.

The parables of the Christ often sting, and intentionally so. They strike us precisely where we may be too blind to see ourselves, precisely where we are most damaged and yet where we are most loath to look, because deep down we probably know what is there and we're fearful of seeing ourselves in our nakedness. Lenten repentance requires self-knowledge from us, an awareness of the state of our own souls. Is our soul in that far off country, or at home with the Father? Are we journeying towards the promised land, or waiting with the older brother just outside the door, refusing to turn and go inside?

All of these are possibilities. There is still time to ask the Christ to grant us His Spirit, to enlighten our hearts and minds so that we might see ourselves truly. No matter where we are, let's strive for daily conversion and for an unceasing desire to be with the Father, knowing that in the Christ He has reconciled us to Himself.



## Weekly Green Living Suggestion...

The United Nations Food and Agriculture Organisation says expansion of agriculture accounts for 70-90% of global deforestation, at least half of that for the production of a few commodities for export. Plus, 15-18% of greenhouse gases globally are due to deforestation. In Indonesia forests have been cut down to plant palms for oil, in the Amazon the rainforest is being cut down to produce beef and leather. (In both these areas the browser Ecosia is planting trees working with local communities). It may seem an insurmountable problem about which we can do very little but the more we think about this and respond in small ways the more we can contribute to change! We just need to ask ourselves where what we buy comes from and whether we can find affordable alternatives to less globally friendly produce.
