## Green Living Update...

**Using public transport** instead of our cars whenever possible is another important contribution to reducing climate change. This can be a real challenge in the winter when the evenings are dark and the weather often inclement.

We also need to **plan journeys more carefully** and factor in the extra time it takes to go down this route. You may have noticed the City Council's efforts to encourage us to do so! Evening car parking charges are back for a start. There are also plans being implemented to **encourage walkers, cyclists and bus users** and discourage car drivers throughout the city.

It is to be hoped that the **buses will be more reliable, more frequent in the evenings and more affordable** for those of us who don't qualify for a bus pass, but wherever possible we should be considering our options and travelling sustainably.
