



Last Judgement – Just and Merciful

City Centre Catholic Parish Southampton

This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King. It is the final Sunday of the liturgical year as we look ahead to Advent and the beginning of a new Church year. Pope Pius XI added the celebration of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe to the liturgical calendar in 1925 in the hope that it would help the Church to respond to rising communism, secularism, and atheism.

In the Gospel reading Jesus tells the disciples of the coming of the Son of Man in His glory, escorted by all the angels, and taking His seat on His throne of glory. It is the Last Judgement. We are told that the judgement involves a separation of people. The king is the divine shepherd Ezekiel foresees in the first reading, judging as a shepherd and separating sheep from goats. It is stark and it resounds with other Old Testament echoes.

So, what kind of king is Jesus? Christ the King proclaims Jesus King of the Universe, the one to whom we must submit in everything. Yet He is also a shepherd and a servant leader. He is the shepherd king who is willing to leave the ninety-nine to find the sheep who has gone astray. He is a king who came not to be served but to serve. He is a king who washes his servants' feet.

The Gospel makes clear that we will be judged on how we treat others, by how much we care for the least of the brothers and sisters because in caring for them we serve Christ. We will be judged on how closely we follow the example of Christ the King, the Good Shepherd and Servant Leader.

Should we fear the judgement ahead of us? When we undertake school or college exams we wonder if we have done enough and there is anxiety until we receive the result. The divine judgment is just but it is also merciful. It is said that encounter with God is both exhilarating and terrifying. It is why the word of God calls us to spiritual alertness, repeatedly exclaiming,"Stay awake!"
