IS HUMILITY AN ARCHAIC VIRTUE IN THE 21ST CENTURY?

Cardinal Rafael Merry del Val was one of the powerful figures of the Catholic Church at the onset of the 20th century. He was born into one of the noble families in Spain, educated in the best schools here in England before going to Rome where he was ordained a priest, consecrated a Bishop at a young age, became the Secretary of State to Pope Pius X in 1903 at the age of 38, and made a cardinal two months afterwards. Although Cardinal Rafael Merry del Val was a refined and an outstanding churchman, he is not known for the above posts he occupied and the authority he wielded; he is known for the LITANY OF HUMILITY which he composed and prayed every day after celebrating Mass. In the Litany of Humility, Cardinal Rafael asked God to deliver him and indeed all of us from the desire of being praised, being preferred to others, and being approved; from the fear of being forgotten, ridiculed and wronged; and to grant us the grace to desire that others be esteemed more than us, increase while we decrease and preferred to us in everything. This sounds harsh, doesn't it?

In this Sunday's readings, we are admonished to be humble in our thoughts, words, and actions. The Greek word for humility as used in our readings this Sunday is Tapeinoo which means to have a modest opinion of oneself and to behave in an unassuming manner. In a world of Me, Myself and I, this invitation can be a daunting task as well as an uphill battle. However, it is important for us to remember that the world does not revolve around ourselves alone; yes, each of us is a first-born son/daughter of God and all of us are citizens of heaven. C.S. Lewis was spot on when he said: "True humility is not thinking less of yourself; it is thinking of yourself less." With the Servant of God – Cardinal Rafael Merry del Val, let us familiarise ourselves with the LITANY OF HUMILITY, asking God for the grace to realise it is not always about us and that none of us is indispensable. Jesus, meek and humble of heart, make our hearts like unto Thine!!!
