The Cost and Joy of Christian Discipleship

What is it that we find hard to let go of? What or who restricts our freedom? Questions that we could all do well to ponder and that is exactly what the Lord was challenging his disciples with. We will all have different notions of the concept of freedom. C.S Lewis writes powerfully in his book 'Surprised by Joy' about his reluctance to commit to faith because he felt that it would compromise his freedom as an individual and particularly as an academic. He spoke of himself as one of the most reluctant converts in the history of Christendom.

He describes the night when he knelt down and acknowledged his need to acquiesce with his maker and accept that there is freedom in obedience. Happiness and freedom are paradoxical in the extreme. You can only have them both by giving them away.

I was blessed to have as my first spiritual director a wonderful Benedictine monk (forgive me if I have mentioned this before). When I questioned his vow of obedience and the fact that everything had to be passed by his Abbot, to the extent of asking permission if he could visit friends outside the monastery, he would reply to me: "Tina, there is a wonderful freedom in obedience: I know exactly where I am". The rule of St Benedict which guides the monastic community and their oblates is gentle but wise in its approach and also speaks of the freedom of obedience. "Listen Oh my son to the precepts of the master and cheerfully receive and execute the admonition of the Father, that by the toil of obedience thou may return to Him"

My journey into the Catholic Church echoes these sentiments. I was looking for a faith structure that was uncompromising but fair: one that doesn't bend the rules but teaches that the essence of love is obedience. The psalmist echoes this in the entrance antiphon 'You are just O Lord and Your judgement is right; treat Your servant in accord with Your merciful love'.

St Paul in his personal letter to Philemon describes the transition of his slave Onesimus. Onesimus was a slave who ran away and sought sanctuary with Paul in his prison cell. Paul became a spiritual father to him, converted Onesimus to Christianity and sent him back not as a slave but as a child of God.

Scholastic philosophy makes a distinction between freedom from and freedom for. There is a false notion that freedom from inhibits us and ties us down. Duty, morality and religion can be interpreted as heavy weights. Freedom for gives us the capacity for self-donation in love, for altruism and service. This is surely what Jesus is referring to when He challenges us to put our discipleship above our family ties.

Last week I was in Lourdes with some wonderful volunteers; many of whom had given up a week of their annual leave at considerable financial cost to come and serve the sick and disabled on pilgrimage. There were some wonderful examples of 'going the extra mile', sharing in the suffering of others and giving way to personal freedom in order to be of service to others. And yet there was great joy: the joy that is expressed by C.S Lewis as he offered up his freedom to participate in the heart of Jesus' mission: a mission of salvation. The sacrificial giving of Himself on the Cross to His Heavenly Father out of love for each one of us. St Benedict also commends us to this mission: 'by giving up our own will we can take up the strong and most excellent arms of obedience to do battle for Christ the Lord, the true King'.

This invitation comes to us all. It is up to us to realise that obedience in love is what sets us free.

A Few Words...


