And so starting with the end is a very useful thing. Our lives gain some of their sense of purpose and shape by having some goals, some ambitions, as well as our ultimate destination. Myra and I have just returned from a long weekend on Brownsea Island in Poole Harbour. We knew it would be cold and largely countryside and so we took thermals, warm sweaters and walking boots. There was no swimwear in the suitcase.

As Christians all of us are well served by being aware of the end, that we will ultimately all be judged. Equally, knowing how we should lead our lives in the here and now is an important part of our formation. We live out our lives cognisant and concerned for our salvation, living each day fully alive, fully awake, seeking to be found worthy to be with God in His glory.

As we embark once again on our passage through Advent, let's give ourselves some time, - some time to take stock, some time to contemplate those moments when we drifted into spiritual drowsiness, or perhaps even complete and utter spiritual slumber. From this contemplation, perhaps only through that contemplation, can we adequately learn to be fully awake to the good news that is coming. Dcn Andy Philpott
