







A pearl worth discovering and one to share

I am fortunate to share an office with colleagues who are constantly seeking new ideas, new ways of doing things but all with the common goal: namely, finding better ways of managing their own lives but more importantly to enhance and support the lives of those we care for: sharing pearls of wisdom that we have picked up from media, tv programmes, journal articles and from other professionals.

We are all on a journey of discovery and discernment. Those on our Alpha journey began by asking 'Is there more to life than this?' followed by 'Who is Jesus?' 'Why did Jesus die?' and this week 'How does God guide us?'. Nicky Gumbel directed us to three key sources: Scripture, prayer and through the 'saints', those significant people whose lives have made an impression on us.

A question that we all might ask is 'How do I know that it is God speaking to me, or is it the voice of my own desires?' and 'How do we distinguish between the two?'

St Paul reminds us that even if we follow our own desires and wander off piste God can bring us back and turn even the most negative situations to ones that celebrate His glory. James Martin in his book on prayer gives wise advice regarding discerning between my voice and God's voice and suggests that we need to ask a number of questions: Is any evil involved? (God does not do evil), Does it make sense? Does it lead to love and charity? Does it fit in with what I know about God? Is it a distraction? Is it a wish fulfilment? Is it important?

Solomon recognised his need for wisdom and this was the pearl that he sought and he was prepared to sacrifice everything of material value in order to serve others. It is worth asking ourselves the question: 'What is it that we seek in life which surpasses all other desires and needs?'

This Saturday our Alpha group are spending a day exploring the Holy Spirit. 'Who is the Holy Spirit?', 'What does the Holy Spirit do?' and 'How can I be filled with the Holy Spirit?'. King Solomon asked for one of the Holy Spirit's gifts: the gift of Wisdom, but there are others: piety, fortitude, knowledge And our understanding and belief is that these gifts/charisms are not just given for our self improvement but to empower and enable those we encounter and those we serve.

We can spend a lot of time, indeed waste a lot of time trawling resources, when the Spirit is calling us to enter into ourselves and discover a peace, and a goodness, a faithfulness and a gentleness, which is Christ within us showing us that our deepest desire is to do His will and that this in itself is sheer grace and gift.

So, we are looking at an alternative solution using a 'digital' organ, costing in the region of £30-£40,000! What's going on?

Hello everyone! This is just a quick message from Fr Tom, the parish priest at St Boniface and the current coordinating pastor of the Southampton pastoral area. As you all well know, the Catholic diocese of Portsmouth has embarked on a Ten-Year Mission Plan (see the document "You will be My Witnesses"), which will merge the 87 current parishes across the diocese into 24 parishes. What does that mean for us here in Southampton? The current parishes of Holy Family, Immaculate Conception, St Joseph's and St Edmund's, St Boniface, St Vincent de Paul and St Theresa of the Child Jesus (Totton) will become one big parish. This will not happen immediately, but rather over the next three to five years. A priest of the diocese will be appointed as parish priest and he will be assisted by a team of assistant priests and deacons. Eventually a new parish pastoral council and a new finance committee will be formed made up of lay representatives from the now current six parishes. I imagine that each of our six parishes will still have a pastoral council and a finance committee, but these will be overseen by the larger pastoral council and finance committee. Fr Benjamin Theobald can fill us in on any of the technical canonical law details.

At this moment, we are still in the discerning phase of our journey. The pastoral area clergy, the chairs of the finance teams and pastoral councils/ESTs and a few other parishioners have met on three occasions in 2023 - in January, April and June. The parish administrators were invited to the last meeting and will continue to take part in future meetings. Our next scheduled meeting is on 16th September 2023. We have simply been considering our local context and options for the future. Though all of us at the meetings expressed some of our legitimate concerns, we have all embraced the reality that we have to move in this direction. The very positive thing is that the diocese welcomes our suggestions and proposals and wants all of us to be part of the planning process. We want to keep you informed about any plans as we move along, so that you all have the chance to offer your feedback. It is important that all parishioners are part of the dialogue. So, stay tuned for more information as we move along. In the meantime, let's keep praying for God's help and guidance. Fr Tom
