How two halfpennies can make more than a penny



Beyond their situation as widows we know little if at all about the two widows in this Sunday's readings. Not much he writes, beyond them both giving literally their all to others and thereby God. The widow in Sidon was on the verge of accepting her death and the death of her son because of malnutrition. Not apparent in our translation, Mark writes in his original Greek, that the widow in the temple gives 'once and for all', she too is on the very verge of death yet still gives to God.

Some might consider their giving, - laying their lives on the line with gifts which could be measured as paltry in comparison to their impact, - as consummate irrationality, giving to the point of self sacrifice. To those who are mindful of the Easter Triduum, the two widows are Christ-like, they have become icons of Christ, a living image of their Saviour.

It is not always easy to give as Christ might give. It is hard to learn that we and our gifts are not in competition. The importance of gifts needs to be recognised in order to grow, because they are often the fruit of the work of others as well as of ourselves.

Gifts like virtues need to be practised, need to be perfected as a relationship and dialogue with friends, spouses, strangers, and yes even enemies. And first and foremost, we have to accept the gifts that we've been given as gifts to all.

As Christians, we do not just emulate, or play the role of, the widows in this story, we also play the role of priests. We are washed not in the water located in the Temple's Court of Priests, but in the blood of the Christ. Each one of us is a priest of the heavenly temple, and are called to be a sign of God's mercy, called to give hope and give consolation. To give meaning and value to those who seek the presence of God.

2. Although the widow was expecting to die (1st reading), Elijah told her "*not to be afraid*". That trust 'saved' her and her son. When have you put your trust in God, others, the future and found all was well? Ponder these occasions and thank God.
3. Christ, the author of the 'Letter to the Hebrews' says (2nd reading) that "*Christ offers himself only once to take the faults of many on himself...*" Do you believe that? Have you 'left' your faults with Christ? He has done the 'job', trust him!

Process of Conversion

In a message to a conference on promoting child safeguarding, Pope Francis urged the people of God to continue in "the journey of personal and community conversion."

"It is a journey that we are called to undertake together as a Church, urged on by the pain and shame of not having always been good guardians, protecting the minors entrusted to us in our educational and social activities," the pope said in the message published on Nov. 4. The pope said that "the culture of death" leads to sexual abuse, the abuse of conscience, and the abuse of power.

Pope John Paul II popularized the phrase the "culture of death" in his 1995 encyclical *Evangelium vitae*, describing it as "a war of the powerful against the weak."
