## Healing Love

Job is often referred to as the prophet of doom and gloom. And yet there will be many in today's society who feel as Job did, with the current political and economic climate and our current world situation...'nothing more than pressed service, and hired drudgery'. It is hard to find good news or joy in our media or to be optimistic about the future. As individuals, particularly those of us in the caring profession or in ministry there may be times when we become overwhelmed by the suffering we see and the complexities and tragedies of life that people are faced with. I am often asked in my role in caring for the dying, 'Does it not all become too much?' knowing that everyone I encounter and support is going to die. The reality for me and many others will be: Yes, it is hard, but I know that I cannot do it in my own strength. St Paul reminds us of our need for humility, not to seek for gratification but to see our ministry as service to others and an opportunity for them to experience the good news. Jesus in the gospels heals Peter's mother-in-law and then finds Himself deluged by the sick possessed of the whole town. Jesus could be described as a 'one-man hospital'. He needed to escape, to find some peace and somewhere to pray. Jesus not only recognised His ministry: to heal and to preach, but also that what is needed first and foremost for the Lord's service is prayer and then fidelity. Jesus comes into Job's world and our world of suffering as God the healer. He gives us His hand as He gave it to Simon's mother-in-law, and He calls us as His followers to bring hope and healing to this suffering world.
