DUC IN ALTUM – PUT OUT INTO THE DEEP!!!

The year 2000 is one I will never forget. It was the year I met Pope St John Paul II in a private audience at St Peter's Basilica, was given an exclusive tour of the Apostolic Palace by Cardinal

Stanislaw Dziwisz (the Pope's private secretary), prayed inside the Pope's private chapel, and was treated to a lovely lunch afterwards by the Pope himself. I was among the group of young seminarians from Nigeria who were officially invited to Rome to celebrate the Great Jubilee Year for Seminarians with the Holy Father. During that private audience with Pope St John Paul II, he repeated a particular phrase that I noted in my journal immediately afterwards. That phrase is "DUC IN ALTUM – Put out into the deep." The Holy Father reminded us as seminarians from Africa not to be afraid of what the Lord wants to do with us, and where He would eventually send us. The Holy Father used the same words while introducing the New Millennium in his 2001 Apostolic Letter – Novo Millennio Inunte (At the Beginning of the New Millennium).

Twenty-two years later, we hear those words of the Holy Father from Christ Himself in today's Gospel. Yes, when Simon and his co-fishermen had worked hard all night and caught nothing, the presence of the Master who stepped-in at the last minute made all the difference. Having beheld the majestic splendour of God, when Jesus beckoned on him to become a fisher of men, Simon like prophet Isaiah in our First Reading of today, left everything and followed Him. Like prophet Isaiah and Simon, all those called by God have been given three tasks – to proclaim the death of Christ for the remission of our sins; to proclaim the resurrection of Christ from the dead, and to proclaim His post-resurrection presence as we hear from St Paul in today's Second Reading. We are the modern-day fishermen and fisherwomen; the only way we can make Christ present in today's world is to dig deep with the witnesses of our lives and put out into the deep waters of the world for a bountiful catch in God's time. May the words of Pope St John Paul II fearlessly revibrate in our hearts – "Duc in Altum – Put out into the deep".

A final meeting for anyone who still wishes to be involved will be on **Tuesday 15th** February at 7pm. If you can come to the session do let me know by email. We will publish all the comments/observations/ suggestions in full; we will send a final version to the Diocese; most importantly the Senior Leadership Team (SLT) and the Evangelisation Strategy Team (EST) will try and pull out important elements to direct our parish development. This is a long-term process and we need to discuss how this process can be pursued, without being laborious, so that this is the Church we become! See 'Tablet' letter elsewhere!

We have to, as it were, live with COVID so, with care (always thinking of others), begin developing the 'new normal' in terms of church practice. Soon we can re-establish holy water stoops; collections; full welcome teams; full Adoration teams; Mass coordinators; altar servers at all Masses......and of course, non-liturgical activities. But we need volunteers......please, please either 're-volunteer' or 'volunteer' for one of these. Next weekend we will put out a volunteer clipboard for some of the above.

The Tablet Weekly Magazine: Topic of the week: Laity on the synod pathway... (A letter from Father Tom Grufferty)

THERE IS a growing number of visionaries who are gifted with a profound understanding of the synodal pathway. They are convinced that the pathway does not begin in the Vatican, nor with the bishops, but in the church pew. A friend of mine, Mgr Vincent Harvey, shared a powerful initiative at a clergy support group meeting we had last Friday. He told us that at all Masses in Southampton City Centre parish the previous weekend hymns were cut to a minimum, there was no homily, and this was replaced by 15 minutes of direct consultation with the laypeople in the pews.

At some Masses the laity were asked two questions and invited to discuss and write down answers; at other Masses, people were invited to simply raise questions in public. Note takers collected the answers. The community is now evaluating the responses, which include criticism of the parish, the diocese, and the Church in general. Small groups in the parish have also engaged in the process on their own initiative, and two evenings are planned in the next few weeks to go even deeper if possible.

Here is one way in which the synodal pathway becomes a trusted route for most people in the community. What everybody needs most is to belong to a community that is truthful, loving, all-embracing. The pandemic may have prevented people from going to Mass, but we really need to ask what other dictatorial judgments have driven people away for ever. I know people who have great faith in God, but they are not in church because it is no longer a community of love with a compassionate Jesus.

I recommend that every parish should follow the excellent example of St Joseph's and St Edmund's, Southampton, and begin to listen carefully to the real needs of every person in the pews. We need others with imagination to obtain the views of those no longer in the pews.

Be ready to help stop assisted suicide amendment.

Right To Life UK has had a challenging and busy month, with the assisted suicide lobby attempting to hijack the Government's Health and Care Bill and force them to lay an assisted suicide bill before Parliament within a year of the Bill passing into law.

The Health and Care Bill will shortly move onto Report Stage where there is a high risk that Lord Forsyth will retable his amendment. As such, Right To Life UK is asking parishioners to sign up to their Action Alerts, so they can effectively participate in their efforts to stop this amendment passing, and others like it. Southampton City Missions Basics Bank are very low on the following: tinned carrots, cold tinned meat (Spam, ham in a can, corned beef etc.) as well as small bags of sugar, rice pudding, milk and coffee.

In 2021, SCM fed people in Southampton **15,575 meals & clothed people 1,430 times.** An increase of 6,112 & 847 respectively on the previous year.
