Prayer, fruitfulness and peace

There is a profound contrast between the unrestrained violence of the Gospel parable and the calm assurance of St Paul in his letter to the people of Philippi. (Philippi, by the way, lay just inland from the northern shores of the Aegean Sea and was abandoned in the 14th century after the Ottoman conquest. It is now marked by the village of Filippoi). Paul knew from his own awful, personal experience the violence of the powerful and the misuse of authority revealed in the reading from Isaiah and the Gospel parable. Paul is not writing about imaginary troubles or minor upsets but the reality of human evil and its consequences.

It is the death of Jesus which is referred to in the parable of the Son and heir. And also in the quotation from Isaiah about the stone that the builders rejected, and of course Jesus who, at His last supper, takes up these ancestral images of the bad vine and the bad vineyard and says 'I am the Good Vine'. He goes on to add that we are His fruitful, or unfruitful, branches in as much as we remain in Him. Just as here at the end of the parable He talks of a fruit-bearing people of God.

Paul's teaching of not worrying and the need for prayerfulness is itself a fruit of the teaching of Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount; therefore do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble. Yet Jesus is constantly telling His disciples not to be afraid perhaps as if the opposite of faith is not unbelief but fear.

Paul's fruit-filled teaching tells us today of that peace is God's own Trinitarian life. A peace in which we live and move and have our being. This peace, which is God, stands guard around us. Paul guides us that prayerfulness must be our continuous conversation with God to whom we honestly express our needs and our thanks. Prayerfulness, the pondering that raises us up, are the lived-out Christian life. This is the fruitfulness of Christ and the fruitfulness of a people whose power, and strength, and comfort flows only through Him.

KEY RETURNS. When a Parish Priest changes it is the custom for all keys to be returned to be reissued out. In preparation for this we are hosting a "key amnesty" where anyone in the parish with keys they no longer need is

politely invited to return them. If you have keys to parish property you must return these to the Parish Office before the 20th of October. If you attach your name to the keys and specify why you need them going forward then they will be added to the list to consider, but otherwise you need not put your name with them. You save the Parish money returning keys you do not need. You can put the keys in the collection bags at Mass, send them to the Parish Office or give them to the welcomers/clergy at Mass to make their way back to the Office (if not obvious, please identify their usage!). If you have keys you use so often you cannot part with them please email the Parish Office which keys you have, or contact us to let us know.

Sunday 9am Choir St Edmund's Mary Berridge is stepping down from her role as choir leader at the 9am. We are very grateful to her for sharing her talents with us for all these years! We are looking for two or three people to take over the following tasks as soon as possible:
