The Three Cs of Baptism

Baptism was the beginning of Christ's public ministry and for the rest of us. Our baptism marks the beginning of our own lives as Catholic Christians. Most of us were baptised as infants, so we don't remember it. The chances are, if we have been a part of a baptism as a parent or a godparent or a relative looking on there's a lot going on that we may not have noticed. Today's feast is a chance to contemplate what this sacrament means and, in particular, how it is celebrated. In essence it comes down to the three Cs: Creation, Commitment and Community.

One of the things we notice about the baptism ritual is that, unlike most of our liturgies, it doesn't begin with a hymn or even a prayer. It begins, instead, with a question: "What name have you given your child?". Everything that follows, flows from that question. Baptism, the first sacrament of initiation, is fundamentally about who we are and who we will be. To be baptised is to be defined in a new way, as a Catholic Christian. We are transformed. We become a new creation. Having a name, an identity, is critical to that. So yes, baptism is about creation in all its wonder, beauty and joy.

It is the commitment of parents and, significantly, godparents. Being a godparent entails commitment; a commitment to the Catholic faith, and to living that faith with fidelity, enthusiasm and joy. That means living it in such a way that our godchildren will see what we do, how we pray, what we value, how we love and they will say: "I want to be like that". Godparents make a commitment to the faith, and to helping their godchildren live that faith.

Early in the rite, the deacon or priest says: "My children, the Christian community welcomes you with great joy". The Church celebrates this sacrament as a community because as a community, we pray together, rejoice together, grow together, grieve together. Christian life isn't lived in isolation, and we don't celebrate our sacraments that way, either. This is why we often baptise several children together on two Sundays a month. It is an experience to be shared.

Creation, Commitment, Community and binding all of these together is Charity, the great bond of love that uplifts us, inspires us and inflames our hearts. These are the raw ingredients of what it means to be a Christian, or as the baptism rite puts it so beautifully: "This is our faith. This is the faith of the Church. We are proud to profess it, in Christ Jesus our Lord.".

This Sunday we welcome in Baptism: Audrey, Ellie, Jacob, Natan, Marcel, Wiktor and George. Pray for them.
