Christ is risen. He is risen indeed Alleluia!

Today is the day of all days that makes sense of everything: life, death, suffering, the meaning of life. We have emerged from the Passion to the Resurrection. Christ offers us the most amazing gift: That in every trial we experience, everything we suffer, He is there with us and has taken it upon Himself and defeated it in His death.

I was privileged this week to attend a funeral of a dear friend and colleague, a deacon of the church and of our diocese. In his last years of life he had shared with me how he was making his soul ready and preparing for death. At his funeral he gave us the words from Cardinal Basil Hume to ponder on "Death is a formidable foe until we learn to make it our friend. Death is to be feared if we do not learn to welcome it". Iain loved life and embraced death. At his requiem we all longed to be able to share with him in his complete certainty of life and death with God.

My twenty five years in palliative care, in caring for the dying, have taught me that my vocation and my ministry is not only to prepare those I am caring for, for death; but for life before and beyond death. The words that we use in the Mass when praying for those who have died 'life has changed not ended' take on an extra dimension. Life changes for the better. St Therese of Lisieux spoke of her own death by saying 'I am not dying, I am entering life'.

Death is the gateway to eternity and the gate way to life in its fullness. Christ said'I have come to give you life and life in its fullness.' This phrase for me has become more meaningful through dear friends who through their life and death have taught me how to make death a friend.

My first spiritual director (a Benedictine monk) would frame everything I shared with him in the context of eternity: I learnt to view and accept my struggles and disappointments as part of this earthly life, and to understand that they were nothing in comparison with knowing the love of God in Christ Jesus: broken relationships needed to be healed and forgiven, or I would find myself imprisoned, in that state of separation from God which is not part of our Easter message. St Paul tells us to 'look for the things in Heaven where Christ is'.

Iain was brought into the church the evening before his requiem: a lovely tradition in our Catholic liturgy. It reminds me of that precious time on Holy Saturday when Christ is waiting in the depths of the earth. We read in the Office of readings: 'Out of love for you I now command all those who are held in bondage to come forth, all who are in darkness to be enlightened. Rise from the dead for I am the life of the dead'. Iain's life and death were both an inspiration and a consolation.

May we all emerge from these three days able to join with confidence in the words of the psalmist: 'This day was made by the Lord: we rejoice and we are glad!'

Questions for the week....

1. What is it that allowed John to "see and believe" (Gospel) to have this kind of clarity? Does love give you knowledge about a person, or insights into their behaviour? In John's Gospel, Jesus said "Whoever loves Me, I will love him [her] and reveal Myself to him [her]" (John 14:21). Is there a connection between Jesus' statement and John's "seeing and believing"?

2. Should we witness with more than words? Peter bore witness in a different manner after the Resurrection than he did before Christ died. To what do you attribute this? Was he consumed by love for Christ and his Gospel? Could the source of strength for Peter be the same source for us?

Weekly Green Living Suggestion...

Take a moment to consider the setting for your **central** heating thermostat. We are emerging from winter so this is something particularly to think about for next winter. Turning your thermostat down, especially when you are away, out or active during the day, should be possible. If you are elderly or infirm/inactive a minimum of 18 degrees is recommended but most of us could get by with 17 degrees. Turning off radiators in rooms you don't use much until you actually need them is another thing to think about. Remembering to switch off lights and appliances when not in use seems obvious but needs a conscious effort as does not leaving things on standby for long periods. SMART meters help us with all these things so have one fitted if you can (older kitchens sometimes make this very difficult or impossible so being self-aware is the best way forward).
