THOUGHTS FOR THE WEEK

- 1. Pope Francis reminds us that Thomas arrived late but that the Lord did not abandon him. He came back the next week. Will God abandon us in our slow recovery from the pandemic? Can we forget those left behind? "Dear brothers and sisters, in the time of trial that we are presently undergoing, we too, like Thomas, with our fears and our doubts, have experienced our frailty. We need the Lord, who sees beyond that frailty an irrepressible beauty. With Him we rediscover how precious we are even in our vulnerability. ... And if, like crystal, we are transparent before Him, His light—the light of mercy—will shine in us and through us in the world." (Feast of Divine Mercy, April 19, 2020)
- 2. The early Church's response to Christ's life, death, and resurrection was their treatment of possessions (1st reading) Compare your attitude toward possessions with theirs.
- 3. Does what you have done make you a Christian, or what Christ has done? (CF 2nd reading). Which is more important, belief in Jesus or performance of good deeds? If you believe deeply and personally in Jesus will good deeds spring from that belief and love? (Anne Osdieck: adapted)

POPE FRANCIS' INTENTION FOR APRIL: Universal: Fundamental rights. For those who risk their lives while fighting for fundamental rights under dictatorships, authoritarian regimes and even in democracies in crisis.

A few words from Father Vincent: Christ is risen......Alleluia! Once again I wish you a very happy, holy and blessed Easter on this Feast of Divine Mercy.

With restricted numbers, the prohibition on congregational singing, and lack of movement, there wasn't the 'energy' or 'buzz' we normally experience during the Triduum. But we were blessed that this year we could actually do something liturgically. Thank you to all who enabled us to celebrate the Triduum and Easter in a dignified, reflective and uplifting way: musicians/singers; servers; lectors; stewards; cleaners; decorators; Parish Office ... thank you, thank you!

Apologies for the streaming 'crash' at 10.30am on Easter Sunday! We are not sure what happened: the Broadcasting system was still broadcasting; YouTube was still streaming ... but people had a blank screen and broken sound! Fingers crossed that it was a temporary issue 'up there' in the cloud! Because those streaming didn't hear/see, I must say you missed a cracking sermon!!!!!!!!! though some would say it was a 'crackling' sermon!! Hey ho!

We slowly continue to move forward into opening up more, but are not fully aware of what that means for our churches. No doubt as June approaches things will become clearer.

Baptisms continue slowly (because of rule of 6 but this is changing); preparation takes place online. First Holy Communion sessions continue online, with 'First Confessions' now taking place, by appointment, on Saturdays in April. Confirmation is still in the air until we hear from Bishop's House.

I have decided to do the 'Pentecost Challenge' for 'Friends of the Holy Land' to raise £1,200 towards the education of a disabled child. I am cycling/walking virtually from Bethlehem to Nazareth see my page https://fhl.enthuse.com/pf/vincent-harvey to donate

Do look at the Paschal (Easter) Candle in St Edmund designed and decorated by Imelda: the 'Tree of Life' (reflecting the 'tree' in the Garden of Eden and the Cross Jesus was crucified on); the 'set-square' and 'lily' to represent St Joseph (we are in the Year of St Joseph) and the chalice/host/grapes to represent the Eucharist. Thank you Imelda.

Keep safe! Be safe! Think of others! And remember: if you suspect you have been near someone with coronavirus, or are not feeling well yourself, stay at home and certainly DO NOT mix with others; also refrain from coming to church; think of others!

DIY ABORTIONS: Last week was the first anniversary of the Government granting access to women obtaining early medical abortions at home (EMA's) which we all know as DIY abortions. The Government are considering making this move permanent. In really an unprecedented move Pro-life organisations have come together to challenge this, and have formed a coalition and they have a website: www.careforwomen.co.uk

What the vast majority of the public don't know has been the repercussions of DIY abortions since its introduction last year:

- 75,000 women have accessed this procedure.
- 11,786 incomplete abortions
- 3,588 surgical interventions
- 264 999 calls
- 495 women attending hospital per month due to abortion complications
- 52 illegal abortions
- 4 abortions at over 24 weeks

There are very valid concerns over coercion and that the service offered crosses legal boundaries.

The Pro-life organisations that have formed this coalition are: Christian Concern/CBRUK/March for Life/Pregnancy Crisis Helpline/Rachel's Vineyard/SPUC/The Good Counsel Network/Voice for Justice/40 Days for life.

Please pray that the government will decide <u>not</u> to make DIY abortions permanent.

- O **Hello Southampton**—volunteers sign up for a regular slot to call a list of people for a shorter check in call.
- O **Telephone befrienders** make a longer call usually once a week. You will need to complete an application form naming 2 people Communicare can approach for a character reference.
