MOTHER OF GOD AND MOTHER OF US ALL!

This weekend we celebrate the feast of the Assumption of Our Blessed Lady. This is a commemoration of the falling asleep of the Virgin Mary because of the tradition that her body did not decay but that she was raised body and soul into Heaven. The tradition was present as early as the sixth century but it was only in the twentieth century that on consultation with all the bishops throughout the word that Pope Pius XII formally declared the Assumption to be part of the authentic doctrine and teaching of the Catholic Church.

As Catholics and particularly for those of us who have been new Catholics there are many challenging mysteries to absorb and believe and not least about Our Blessed Lady; she was immaculately conceived, she is the Mother of God, and she was assumed into Heaven.

We are constantly reminded of that our faith is not simply about belief, it is about relationship; we are relational people and Christ is calling each one of us into a living relationship. The Alpha journey, which has become one of the foundational stones of our parish life invites us to experience that relationship, to move what is in our heads into our hearts.

For me there are similarities with our understanding of Mary, the Mother of God. As someone who was not brought up with Mary I have had to learn and understand her significance but most importantly not only to ask myself the question 'Who is this woman?' but 'Who is this woman to me?'

Our Lady has called me to the pilgrimage site of Lourdes for many years; firstly as a non-Catholic but latterly as part of the Catholic Association Pilgrimage. Like many sceptical non-Catholics I initially struggled with the huge attraction and devotion to Mary, and yet she called me back year after year. The statue in the grotto is entitled "I am the Immaculate Conception", the title Our Lady gave herself when appearing to Bernadette. I was born on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception! (again not a coincidence but part of the plan, I think!) The feast of the Assumption for me gives greater clarity and conviction to Mary's Immaculate Conception. She is the Mother of God, and God can have no beginning or end. Mary was not born as you and I were born and she is now with God in Heaven.

On our pilgrimage to the Holy Land in 2018 we visited the Dormition Abbey in Jerusalem where there is a beautiful statue of Mary in a deep sleep. Above the statue in the centre of the cupola, Jesus is depicted calling His mother to heaven. I remember at the time asking one of our pilgrimage leaders to explain its significance. Now that I have a better understanding, our Lady has given me yet another gift. I believe that those I have lost are 'asleep in Christ' and as Mary always pointed the way to her Son she is giving us added confirmation that our loved ones are safely sleeping until the resurrection. Having lost my own earthly mother four years ago I am sustained, comforted and deeply grateful for my spiritual mother who is truly with God in Heaven, body and soul.

GENERAL ITEMS

POPE FRANCIS' INTENTION FOR AUGUST: Evangelisation: for the Church, that She may receive from the Holy Spirit the grace and strength to reform herself in the light of the Gospel.

VICTORY OVER JAPAN DAY: VJ Day this year falls today, Sunday, August 15. The day marks the moment Imperial Japan surrendered in the Second World War, bringing the war to an end. While August 15 is the official VJ Day for the United Kingdom, the official US commemoration is on the 2nd September.

We recall this event to pray for those who died, were injured and affected during the War, and for those who continued to suffer due to the conflict. We also pray for lasting world peace and a cessation of war anywhere.

Patrick Nolan, of County Welford, Eire, captured by the Japanese at the Fall of Singapore in March 1942. Transferred by hell ship to the Solomon Islands and held captive with a group of 600 soldiers known as the Gunner 600. On liberation day 15 August 1945 only 18 survived, Patrick being one of them. His Catholic faith kept him strong. Father of Tessa, Cait, Mairin & grandfather of Leila. We remember the poor souls who perished and are thankful for those who returned.

DIOCESAN PRESS STATEMENT: The Diocese released the following press statement this week regarding the use and promotion of the Covid Vaccine. "The Catholic Diocese of Portsmouth is very disappointed that one of the Family of Mary Immaculate and St Francis in Gosport has publicly expressed a personal view about the Covid vaccination Catholic Church and the Diocese. The matter is being taken very seriously and an investigation is in progress. The Pope has encouraged the take up of the vaccination programme. The Vatican's doctrinal office issued a note last December reinforcing this position saying it is "morally acceptable" for Catholics to take vaccines against the coronavirus. While the Vatican note does not recommend that vaccination against the coronavirus be made mandatory it says "the morality of vaccination depends not only on the duty to protect one's own health, but also on the duty to pursue the common good." In this Diocese Bishop Philip Egan has reinforced that position through publications to the diocese over past months. We would encourage all our parishioners to benefit from the protection afforded by the vaccine".
