MASSES ARE BEING STREAMED:

SUNDAY MASSES: Do not turn up without booking on Eventbrite as you may be denied entry (they may be space but you are taking a risk!). **Congregational singing** you may **hum through your mask)! Masks still to be worn.**

A few words from Father Vincent

Thank you to **Father Emmanuel Emalume** for presiding at the 6.15pm & 10.30am Masses this weekend. Thank you to all who are supporting me during Father Ansel's absence. Next weekend we welcome back Canon Nick.

The Government has now lifted all COVID restrictions but advised us all to be 'cautious'. That seems a bit of a 'get out' but that is where we are! We have to get back to a sense of normality, and regain as it were, our lives; but in doing so we are moving into uncharted territory. So, as mentioned last week, we in the Parish will err on the side of caution for the sake of the wider community, especially the elderly, the infirm and the vulnerable.

See elsewhere for specifics but to mention some of our 'opening up' moves and some of our ongoing 'restrictions' as from Monday 1. We strongly encourage people to wear masks in the churches to minimise airborne viruses; the one way system will remain; Holy Communion still on the hand (though as we unlock further we are looking at some way to provide Holy Communion on the tongue for those who really insist: my fear being that if one person who receives in that way has COVID they will almost certainly contaminate the next person AND the rest of the consecrated hosts! This has happened elsewhere!); we will still limit maximum numbers but will double capacity by removing distancing and allowing benches to be full (though still blocking off every alternate bench); still discourage singing though sing behind your mask if you wish (we will not use hymnbooks yet); sanitising still on entry (and exit if you desire); cancel booking for Mass on a weekday, but still book for a weekend; stewards only at a weekend.

Thanks to the Church Opening Working Group see more details elsewhere. Remember, though, still be alert, and clean hands and be careful of face!

GRANDPARENTS ASSOCIATION

The Holy Father has nominated Sunday 25^{th} July 2021 as the first World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly.

Archbishop Michael Neary, Archbishop of Tuam, was guest speaker at the Grandparents' Faith Café on Tuesday 13 July 2021.

The Faith Café is an initiative of the Catholic Grandparents' Association which was introduced during the Covid-19 pandemic as a social and spiritual space for Grandparents to meet online once a month to chat, to offer prayers and intentions and to just be together in the spirit of faith. It has been a lifeline for so many people during this time of pandemic and has connected Grandparents across the world from Ireland to the USA, from the UK to Australia.

The event ran from 7:30pm to 8:30pm (Irish time) and 1:30pm Central Time USA and Canada on Tuesday 13 July.

PILGRIMAGE TO FATIMA AND LISBON

NEXT STEPS IN OUR CHURCHES / PARISH OUT OF LOCKDOWN:

As written elsewhere we are going to err on the side of caution and unlock in 3 phases beginning on Monday 19th July with **Phase 1**:

- To cease the need for stewards on weekday Masses (including Sat 11am)
- To cease the need to book for Mass on weekdays (including Sat 11am)
- To continue to have stewards at all Sunday Masses (including 6:15pm)
- To continue to require booking for all Sunday Masses
- To continue to encourage all Mass attenders to wear face coverings when in the churches at all Masses
- To continue to expect all Mass attenders to use hand sanitiser on entry to the churches at all Masses
- To continue to ask stewards to check people in at Sunday Masses
- To continue to ask stewards to cleanse the seating etc. after Sunday Masses
- To continue to require use of the one way system in the churches
- To continue to ask stewards to 'usher' people for Holy Communion at Sunday Masses
- To ask those attending weekday Masses to help cleanse the seating at the end of Mass. Perhaps those with stewarding experience might guide others in the early days of this if they are at Mass
- To increase the capacity of our churches by limiting social distancing in the pews currently in use and gradually open up more pews

Hopefully, it is apparent that we are gently opening up capacity, but using prudent caution, and as experience and the pandemic demands, further review any relaxation of measures. We hope this will give people who may feel vulnerable or nervous more confidence to attend.

The reintroduction of an 11am Mass will be determined more by the availability of a priest than anything else.
